

Flint Community SPEAK at TEMPLE BETH EL Organizers



On March 13, we welcomed Flint residents and community organizers Nayyirah Shariff and Melissa Mays to speak at Brotherhood Breakfast.

They told powerful stories of daily life in Flint, including difficulties with personal hygiene, lack of access to emergency resources and information, and frustration over not having access to clean water in their homes. Melissa told of her young sons who now suffer from bone and muscle pain, memory loss and inability to concentrate, as well as her own health concerns including cirrhosis and seizures. Nayyirah shared how groups are organizing and responding to the crisis in Flint. Member Justin Wedes, who also sat on the panel, spoke about regional water issues including mass shut-offs in Detroit and water unaffordability.

Nayyirah and Melissa also spoke to our TBE 5th grade religious school class. The students asked questions about life in Flint and how kids are being affected. Nayyirah and Melissa wanted the students to understand that each person can make a difference and to stand up for what they believe is right. They encouraged the students to keep asking questions, talk to their friends and families, and continue their pen pal project with students in Flint.



He now serves as a science adviser to Al Gore's Climate Project. He is the author of *Uncertain Science*, *Uncertain World* and *A World without Ice*.

JHSM honors Jan Durecki, Archivist, Rabbi Leo M. Franklin Archives at the Jewish Historical Society of Michigan 57th Annual Meeting

"I Didn't Know That!: The Best of the Archives' Jewish History Detective Series" will provide guests with a bevy of interesting characters and fascinating facts that reconnects with some of Jewish Detroit's long-lost history. The "Best Of" presentation will be co-hosted by former WXYZ reporter, Cheryl Chodun.

Co-presenting the award to Jan Durecki will be JHSM president, Michael Maddin; the daughter of Leonard Simons, Mary Lou Zieve; and Judge Walter Shapero, whose wife Mary Shapero, of blessed memory, was the granddaughter of Rabbi Franklin. The Rabbi Leo M. Franklin Archives, founded in 1981 using materials collected by Leo M. Franklin and Irving Katz, collects and preserves the history of TBE, and family records, manuscripts, photos, audio visual materials, rare books, drawings and other materials dating back to the mid-1800s.

Jan has delved into the lives of Jewish men and women and their contributions to community life in both Detroit and Michigan. In her ten years, she has worked with dozens of researchers and groups, and has added the archives of the Jewish War Veterans of Michigan and the Greater Detroit Chapter of Hadassah to the collection. She helped direct the evolution of the Franklin Archives from an obscure space at Beth El to a state of the art, modern climate controlled room, and she launched the highly popular Jewish History Detectives Lecture series, sponsored by Dr. Robert and Joan M. Jampel.

Jan will present a retrospective of her annual Jewish History Detectives Lecture Series titled "I Didn't Know That!" - a look back at memorable topics that will acquaint you with little aspects of local Jewish history.



Passover is a great holiday. There are few things I enjoy more than sitting around the table, eating my Hillel sandwich, sharing family stories, and reading the greatest story ever told. But I struggle every year with translating the core message of Passover into action in my life. What are the things that have kept me from reaching my full potential? Which relationships have not been fulfilling? When will I take advantage of my freedom to bring more holiness into the world?

One of the small but meaningful symbols at our Seder is leaning on a pillow. It is supposed to make us comfortable, and represent the opposite of the physical hardship we experienced during slavery and in the desert. But one of my teachers, Rabbi David Wolpe, points out that most of us - and certainly our American Jewish community in general - experience a fair amount of comfort on a daily basis. We are a successful, thriving community. Our ancestors never could have imagine the heights we have reached. Which means that leaning on a pillow isn't so out of character, and doesn't offer the stark contrast that it may have for generations of Jews who continued to wander and yearn for safety.

Perhaps more helpful would be to take a moment during our Seder to sit on a rigid, uncomfortable chair. Or on the floor. To remind ourselves that there are still many people (including those in our own community) who struggle on a daily basis. Who have not achieved the blessing of freedom. Who do not have the luxury of celebrating the simple pleasures.

Each of us should enjoy the wonderful holiday of Passover to the fullest degree we can. And I pray that the next day, we will come together and seek out opportunities to spread our blessings to others, and fulfill our Jewish mission to be God's partners in transforming the world.





TUNISIAN SQUASH PUREE

- 1 ½ lbs. Pumpkin or Butternut Squash
- 2 T Olive Oil
- 1 t Ground Caraway
- 1 t Ground Coriander
- 2 Cloves Garlic, Minced
- ½ t Harissa
- Salt to taste
- 3 T Fresh Lemon Juice

Preheat the oven to 400. Cut pumpkin in half and place face down on a baking sheet; butternut squash may be baked whole. Bake until soft, about 1 hr. Seed, scoop out the flesh and mash coarsely. In a small saute pan or skillet, heat the oil over low heat. Add the caraway and coriander and stir until fragrant. Add the mashed squash, garlic, and harissa and heat through. Season with salt and lemon juice. Serve at room temperature. Serves 4 – 6.
