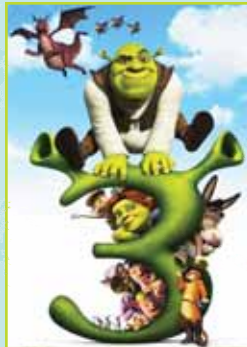

Hin'ni

Oscar Wilde said, “The consciousness of loving and being loved brings a warmth and richness to life that nothing else can bring.” If we accept that premise, then it is not just the acts of loving and being loved that adds dimension to life, but the consciousness of those acts. The awareness of that which enhances one’s life adds further enhancement.

Bringing this same consciousness into our prayers adds a palpable sense of intention, or kavanah. For me, this idea is beautifully articulated by the prayer Hin’ni, which is read or chanted near the beginning of Erev Rosh Hashanah. When Moses answered God, he says Hineini, Here I am. But it is not to be taken just at its literal translation. It is interpreted to mean I am here; I am present with my whole self. When I chant Hin’ni, I am letting God know that I am here, ready and available to be the mouthpiece for the prayers of my congregation, asking that I be worthy of my leadership role at such an awesome time.

As we head into this season, I am profoundly aware that I am beginning my last year of my Cantorial Certification program at Hebrew Union College – Jewish Institute of Religion. I have spent the last three years developing spiritually and academically, growing into the Cantor that I will truly become at my graduation in New York on May 4, 2016. My learning process will not end here, as I hope we all continue learning and growing throughout our careers and our lives, but it will be a great milestone, and I look forward to celebrating with you at my certification recital here at TBE on April 30, 2016. I do believe that this program has allowed me to continue to expand my role as a member of Beth El’s clergy, and I am grateful to the leadership for allowing me the time to focus on my studies. I now have an increased reservoir of information and experience to draw upon as I give you, my congregation, my focused presence throughout the coming year.

I have also brought this intention into my relationship with my daughter, Ilana. I relish the moments when my awareness of my love for her makes time move more slowly. When people remind me to hold onto these moments, to pay attention to this wonderful time in her life, because she will grow up so quickly, I am so happy to say truthfully, “I know.” It is true. Our lives can speed by, but if we are wise, this sense of the impermanence of life can help us be more present, giving our lives more meaning and impact.

I wrote the following, which highlights this view, in my baby journal right after High Holy Days 5772, which I led just 5 weeks after her birth: “I think about my first major piece every

HHD, Hin’ni. It means something new this year. Yes, I am here, I am present, for my congregation. I will try to be worthy of my role in their lives, as I use my voice to pray on their behalf. But this year, I



am here for you, my child. I am present in my relationship with you. I am taking on this role of Mama with dedication and joy... There are and will be other important things in my life, but behind them all, between, around, and on top of them all, there is you. Hineini, my daughter. I am here. I am yours. Here I am.”

May this season be for each of you one of connection, inspiration, and the consciousness of loving and being loved.

Good evening ladies and gentlemen. It has been my honor and pleasure to serve as your President over the past 12 months. And I am pleased to report that at Temple Beth El, our spirit is growing! Tonight, I have three items I would like to discuss with you. First, I'd like to take this opportunity to thank all the people who helped me during my first year as President. Secondly, I'd like to review many of the changes that we've implemented over the past several months, and what they mean for the Temple. Finally, I'd like to talk a little bit about both current and future initiatives.

First and foremost, to my dear wife, Anne Weiner, thank you, thank you, thank you! Your support and wise counsel have been invaluable. I am blessed to have you by my side throughout this adventure.

I am also quite fortunate to have a capable and competent Executive Committee, including John Kessler, Jordon Wertheimer, David Foltyn, Todd Sable, Robin Fenberg, Liz Modell, Warren Rose, and immediate past president, Raymond Rosenfeld. Each of these individuals has made valuable contributions to your Temple this past year, and that's why I'm fortunate that they have each agreed to serve for another year. They will no doubt continue to help make important strategic and policy decisions that will shape our Temple's direction for years to come.

I want to thank Rabbi Miller, Rabbi Syme and Cantor Kalmowitz for their ongoing commitment and dedication to serving our congregation. They each bring a unique passion and devotion that I deeply appreciate and respect. It continues to be a privilege to work with them. And to the entire staff, who are too numerous to mention, thank you for your kind assistance and hard work as we forge ahead with new ideas and approaches to meeting the needs of our congregation.

My friends, we are in the midst of substantial changes at this institution, changes that are required in order to keep the Temple both relevant and financially secure. And these changes are being effectively implemented by a motivated and energized staff who are collectively improving the way we conduct our affairs at Temple Beth El. I'd like to recognize some of those staff members now.

First, Abby Suckow joined us as our new Controller a year and a half ago. With the extensive involvement of Robin Fenberg, our treasurer, Abby has completely retooled our financial record-keeping processes and procedures, improved our human resource management functions, nurtured our banking relationships, and brought to the table an analytical capability that has become instrumental in helping staff make prudent decisions about the use of Temple funds. We promoted Abby to Chief Financial Officer last January, and continue to rely on her extensive experience to deliver sound fiduciary decisions on behalf of the congregation. In fact, the accounting firm of Wolinski and Co. just last month completed a full independent audit of our books and concluded that our financial statement met the highest standards achievable. And we are now embarking on an accounting software conversion that should bring us out of the Dark Ages and into the Modern Era! Abby is an extraordinarily hard worker with a can-do attitude and a cooperative demeanor that makes her a pleasure to work with.

Halye Aisner joined us last fall as Communications Coordinator, and in conjunction with graphic designer, Marie Curtis, has brought a new level of professionalism and vibrancy to our Bulletin, our webpage, and all our forms of communication. Thanks to both Halye and Marie for their combined efforts to improve our communications across the board.

Our next important engagement was the selection of Rachel Rudman, our Director of Programming. Rachel is a bright young superstar, with an impressive education and capabilities well beyond her years. She has assumed broad responsibilities at the Temple, and working closely with Rabbi Miller, has already delivered terrific new programming. She deserves particular recognition for assisting in the successful Lawson Youth Institute

weekend trip last winter, in which our teens experienced a combination of fun and community building that helped resurrect this important annual event. Rachel also played a major role in organizing both the Glazer Institute and the Adult Purim Party.

She has also done a wonderful job of engaging with many of our active Temple Beth El affiliates, including the Sisterhood, the Brotherhood, the newly re-named Beth Elders (formerly the Ambassadors), and the Kid-ish Club. These are just a few examples of her accomplishments; I know she will continue to collaborate with our entire staff to deliver provocative programming, attractive to a wide variety of our constituents, in an organized and economically responsible way. I look forward to watching her create new and exciting programs for all of us to enjoy...thank you Rachel!

Batting cleanup in the order, and deservedly so, is our new Director of Education, Debbie Morosohk. Debbie has the formidable task of reinvigorating all aspects of our educational programs at Temple, particularly the Religious School and Early Childhood Center. Debbie's credentials and field experience place her at the top of the class in reform Jewish education today, and quite frankly, she's already wowed many of us with her breadth and depth of knowledge about successful strategies in Jewish education. Specifically, Debbie has proposed a comprehensive series of changes to the Religious School that will be implemented with our teachers over the summer for rollout in the fall.

All grades will be experiencing new approaches in our classrooms and newly developed curricula, designed to connect our students and families to both their Beth El community and Jewish learning and living.

Grades K-2 will have weekly T'filah services, with joyful prayers and melodies that will resonate with them for a lifetime. Grades 2-5 will be participating in the "Hebrew Through Movement" program, a non-traditional, playful approach that provides students the foundation for learning the Hebrew skills they will need for prayer and Torah reading. This modern method is a proven system that is vastly superior to the old-fashioned approach we all



experienced in Hebrew school. Fifth and sixth graders will experience a newly designed B'nai Mitzvah Club, in which students will receive both individualized attention and group instruction to learn Hebrew reading skills that prepare them to become B'nai Mitzvah. Grade 7 will have its own innovative program emphasizing the importance of various Jewish commandments; students will participate in programming that reaches out to the greater Detroit community. Students in Grades 8-10 will create their own individualized experience by selecting electives ranging from conversational Hebrew and the Holocaust to community based programs and social programming. Finally, Grades 11-12 will participate in their own monthly seminars, gathering over dinner with guest speakers to engage in discussions about timely issues facing our Jewish community. This programming is designed to stimulate thinking and encourage our young adults to be active participants in Jewish living in college and beyond.

This much needed modernization of our Religious School curricula represents only one of Debbie's many initiatives, yet is a vitally important step toward the institutional goal of attracting and retaining young families with children. A vibrant Religious School program is a foundational cornerstone in reestablishing Beth El's prominence as a leading reform institution. I'm extraordinarily excited about the opportunity to work with Debbie to make this a reality. And I'm pleased to announce that Debbie recently engaged Susie Weiner as our new Director of Early Childhood Education. Susie will run our Early Childhood Center and play a major role in guiding the Temple's programming for young families. She has a master's degree in early childhood education and more than 20 years' experience. Susie has been on board for less than 2 weeks, and has already impressed our ECC parents with her knowledge and enthusiasm...welcome to Susie, another great addition to our team!

Now I'd like to tell you a little bit about my new best friend, our terrific Executive Director, Kim Raznik! Kim joined us less than four months ago, coming from the Jewish Community Center in West Bloomfield, where she was Director of Operations. Kim has an impressive resume with more than 25 years of national broadcasting management experience with NBC News in California. It was pure serendipity that she and her husband, Joe, relocated to Michigan with their adorable children, Hannah and Chloe, to be near Joe's family.

In four short months, Kim has tackled an abundance of issues, including instituting performance reviews for our staff, implementing security training and documentation, renegotiating our electricity, landscaping, and printing contracts, all with substantial savings, and facilitating the successful migration of the Temple's computer system from a server based model to Microsoft Outlook 365 on the cloud. Kim has begun establishing partnerships with other

Jewish agencies in the community, applied for a \$75,000 security grant from the Department of Homeland Security, and provided CPR training for staff. Her ongoing projects include the provision of live streaming of services from both the sanctuary and the chapel, which will be activated in a few short weeks, improved Wi-Fi throughout the building, the replacement of our antiquated membership tracking software, the renewal of our catering contract, and the replacement of the lighting system in the sanctuary. She is also working with lay leadership to make recommendations to the board regarding modifications to our by-laws, our dues structure, our dues review and membership processes, and the potential implementation of a building usage fee.

Kim is consistently challenging, rethinking, and improving operational and administrative processes and policies across the board, while building meaningful and personal relationships with each congregant she engages. And she is building a close and trusting relationship with the staff that has already generated a new level of cooperation and professionalism in every aspect of the services we provide to our membership. Needless to say, Kim has been a fabulous addition to our Temple team. If you haven't already done so, please take the time to meet Kim. I know you'll be impressed.

I would like to take full credit for hiring all this impressive talent, but in reality, it was a team effort, involving lay leadership, the clergy, and notably, the Chair of our Personnel Committee, and the newest member of the Executive Committee, Maxine Lievois. Maxine, thank you for your diligent and thoughtful assistance in facilitating many of these new hires. I would also like to take this opportunity to thank Cindy Bolokofsky, who graciously filled in as a volunteer Executive Director for over seven months, interfacing effectively with both the staff and the congregation during our search for a new Executive Director.

This year also marked the retirement of two individuals who served the Temple for many decades. Both Barbara Grant and Arlene Keller touched the lives of many during their long service to Temple Beth El. Best wishes to both of them going forward. Barbara will continue to support us as a volunteer assisting Jan Durecki in our fabulous archives, and I know Arlene and her husband Paul will remain active members of our congregation. Thanks again to both of you for all you've done over the years.



In the midst of what has been a whirlwind of personnel additions at the Temple, I am pleased to report that Rabbi Miller and his team have continued to deliver new and improved programming and activities, all geared toward improving the quality of congregational experiences both inside and outside the walls of this magnificent edifice. Small Fry Shabbat, Tot Shabbat, Family Kabbalat Shabbat, Havdallah in the Park, and the awesome first Friday of every month Music Shabbat continue to attract increasing numbers of members looking for authentic Jewish services geared to their particular needs. The seven part series entitled Jewish Parenting and Jewish Living was a big success, and the recent series addressing End-of-Life Decision-Making has also been extremely well received. Family Movie Nights, the Summer Kick-off Barbecue, and the upcoming Annual Community Concert are just a few more examples of our ongoing effort to

provide opportunities for families and kids to build upon their Beth El relationships.

And just last week, in response to the terrible killings in South Carolina, we joined hands with Reverend Kenneth Flowers and our friends at the Greater New Mount Moriah Missionary Baptist Church to show solidarity between blacks and whites, Christians and Jews. We conducted shared services at both houses of worship, which was met with critical acclaim on television and in the news, from the Detroit Free Press to the Times of Israel. Rabbi Syme had the vision to initiate our relationship with Reverend Flowers almost 20 years ago, and we remain committed to inter-faith engagement as a fundamental mission of our institution. I was so proud that our congregation filled the pews last Sunday in Detroit. What a great way to show our congregational commitment to social justice.

Last year at this time, I spoke to you about the fact that all across America. Reform congregations are experimenting with all types of new and creative approaches to meet the ongoing challenge of attracting and retaining young families, especially those with children. We, too, face that challenge, and what I have learned from Rabbi Miller over the past year is that unfortunately, there is no one magic bullet available to generate this influx of new members. In the business world, we can do an advertising blitz, lower our prices, or offer other incentives. But congregational membership and the loyalty that comes with it can't be bought; we must earn it over the long term by offering a broad palate of programs and services, both here and in the community at large, while attending carefully and with much

detail to the needs of our members. Success at any one moment is very hard to measure or test...yet I am more confident today than I've ever been that we are headed in the right direction, and we are beginning to experience the fruits of our collective labor!

We have several activities and initiatives that we are pursuing in the coming year. As many of you know, we recently installed a new

sound system in the sanctuary. That system will soon be complemented by live internet streaming of our services, which will further enhance our ability to reach current and future members who want to share our services and cannot be physically present. These improvements are thanks to the generosity of the DeRoy Testamentary Foundation, and are part of our continuing effort to improve communications and accessibility for our membership.

And speaking of accessibility, we are working on installing an architecturally appropriate hand railing on the steps leading up to the bimah in the sanctuary. This is in response to requests from some of the elder statesmen and stateswomen in our congregation who want to continue to participate on the bimah at life cycle events but find climbing the steps a challenge.

Our Temple has a long and illustrious history of volunteerism and outreach to the broader community. Although Rabbi Syme's Mitzvah Meals program has been suspended because of the sale of Hiller's Markets, we fully intend to reinstate the program with a new partner as part of our ongoing commitment to making our community stronger and advocating for those less fortunate than ourselves. And we intend to continue to provide more opportunities to build bridges throughout the community on behalf of our congregation, particularly through outreach to the young Jewish community in urban Detroit.

In October, Mark and Rachel Ann Miller, in conjunction with the exceptional Phyllis Loewenstein, will lead a congregational trip to Israel. And we have begun discussions about a trip to Israel for young families in December of 2016. Temple had over 40 members attend the AIPAC Policy Conference in Washington last spring; we will continue to prioritize our support of the State of Israel through education, programming and travel opportunities.

Beyond improved communications, a focus on renewed volunteerism, and a continued commitment to Israel, our clergy are committed to providing new and creative opportunities to engage children and young families. We recently met with Federation's Jewish Teen

Engagement Task Force to explore and determine the best methods for engaging more Jewish teens in a greater number of Jewish teen experiences.

Federation is offering a program to assist in both the training and funding of a Director of Youth Engagement, or in their vernacular, a Jewish Teen Network Weaver, a full-time youth professional charged with the task of connecting Jewish teens to Jewish programming, including youth group events, retreats and overnights, leadership training, and community service. This is a very exciting opportunity that will allow us to leverage our resources and create an immediate impact on our youth. We hope to earn Federation's support and fill this position by the end of the summer.

This fall we will celebrate the 165th anniversary of the founding of this historic institution with a Gala on November 7th, featuring nationally renowned comedian and impressionist Dave Coulier and the musical group Collision Six, winner of the 2014 Detroit City Voter Award for Best Local Band. The Gala is being planned by Melissa Schiller and Traci Feldman, with assistance from Anne Weiner, Kim Raznik, Rachel Rudman and many others. It promises to be a great evening of entertainment and fun for all...I implore you to attend!

And finally, I want to inform you that I have been working with our caterer, Cutting Edge Cuisine, on a project to fully renovate the kitchen. After 40 plus years, that facility is tired and due for a complete upgrade. In conjunction with this effort, we are exploring alternative sources of funding to facilitate the total renovation of Handleman Hall. The Executive Committee and Board of Trustees recognize that modernization of our kitchen and meeting space is a critical element required to best meet the needs of our members as they plan major celebrations in their lives, events which should occur at the Temple, but are being scheduled elsewhere because our facilities just don't measure up.



Lay leadership has agreed that this investment can play an important role in attracting and retaining new members. Furthermore, a well-executed renovation will generate a substantial increase in our catering income and help in the ongoing challenge of balancing the budget. A project of this nature can be complicated and time-consuming, and requires much consensus building. So although I cannot commit to a schedule or budget for this ambitious project at this time, I can promise you that one of my main objectives this coming year is to move forward in the design, funding and implementation of this needed renovation.

In conclusion, the past 12 months have been very demanding on our clergy, staff and lay leadership. Implementing change can be difficult, particularly because it requires a willingness to experiment, try new approaches, and sometimes fail, while maintaining a respectful and open discourse with all parties involved. And yet the changes we are promoting at Temple Beth El are no less than a microcosm of the changes being experienced by Reform Jewish institutions across America in the 21st century. These changes are crucial to our future, and in my humble opinion, our future looks brighter than ever! I am grateful to all who have guided, advised and supported me in my efforts to advance our mission. Your support and goodwill have kept me fully engaged and ever more optimistic about the role that Temple Beth El can play in our lives and in our community. Thanks to every one of you for giving me the opportunity to serve as your president.

Tonight I have the pleasure of awarding the President's Cup, emblematic of dedication and committed service to Temple Beth El. Our first recipient is an extraordinarily talented business professional who has committed a tremendous amount of personal time leading the effort to instill discipline in the management of our financial affairs.

Since becoming treasurer three years ago, this individual has made an incredible impact on the way we understand and manage our money. Specifically, she single-handedly imposed the requirement for a full audit of our books, resulting in a lengthy list of specific recommendations from the auditors which have, under her careful guidance, been fully implemented.

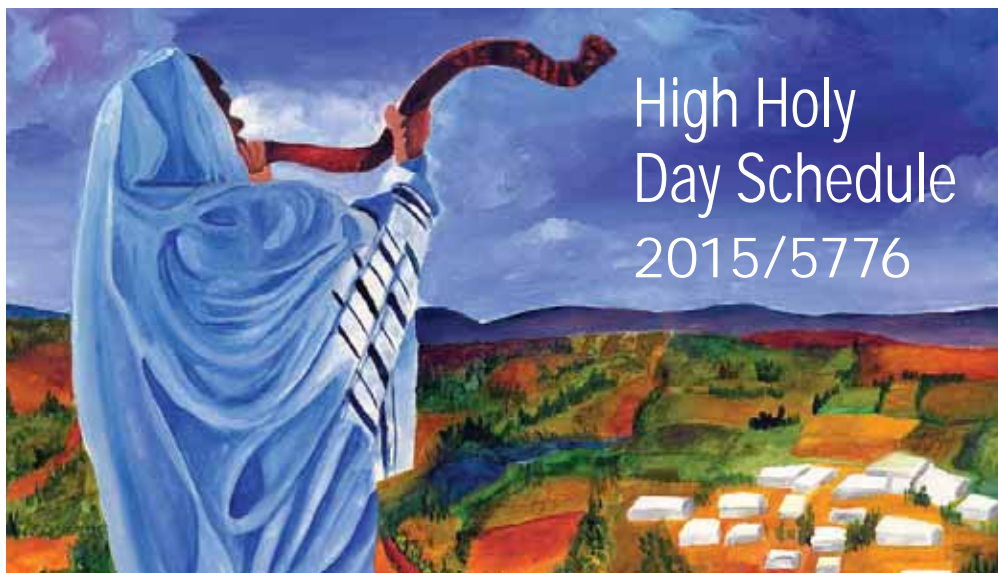

The Trial Of Henry Ford A Documentary in Progress

The Trial of Henry Ford is the working title of a documentary in production. The film will bring to life the riveting story of one of the most important libel lawsuits in American history, Sapiro v. Ford, which is now largely forgotten. This case pitted the richest and most famous man in America, Henry Ford, against a brilliant young lawyer, Aaron Sapiro, who was making a name for himself organizing farmers into cooperative associations during the early 1920s. Ford saw Sapiro as the vanguard of an international Jewish conspiracy bent on taking over America. Ford used his newspaper, *The Dearborn Independent*, to conduct a smear campaign against him. After failing to convince Ford to retract his wild allegations, Sapiro sued him in Federal Court for libel. This set in motion a two year-long roller coaster ride of battles and skirmishes in the courts and in the press until Ford finally publicly apologized in 1927 and shut down his hate-spewing newspaper.

The public and the press saw this as more than an individual libel suit brought by Sapiro against Ford. To them it became a case about hate-speech against all Jews. The story is relevant today because, sadly, anti-Semitism and other forms of hate and bigotry are still with us today. Aaron Sapiro's courage is an inspiring example of what it takes to stand up to hate. The film will serve as a reminder that we all have a stake in challenging hate and bigotry, and a responsibility. The team at Michael Rose Productions is committed to bringing this story to the public.



One important caveat – this is not an indictment of the current Ford Motor Company, the descendants of Henry Ford or the employees of the company. The Ford Motor Company has gone to great lengths to show its support for Jewish causes, as the sole sponsor of the television airing of “Schindler’s List,” and through its generous donations to Jewish causes and by continuing to do business with Israel after the Six Day War (when other companies buckled under Arab pressure to boycott Israel.)

An indication of how the company has changed since its founder’s day is seen in the executive suites. Mark Fields, the current CEO of Ford is Jewish. That said, we cannot let the good works of the current company act as a self-imposed censorship board to keep us from telling this important but largely forgotten and suppressed story. We welcome the opportunity to interview Henry Ford’s living heirs to discuss his legacy. We will offer them this opportunity. A recognition of the company’s tremendous transformation will come when Steven Spielberg and USC Shoah Foundation honor William Clay Ford, Jr., Executive Chairman Of Ford Motor Company, at the Foundation’s Ambassadors for Humanity Gala in Detroit on September 10, 2015.

Parker, Head of Facilities at the school, came to pick up the desks and promised us that they would be appreciated and well used by Glazer students.



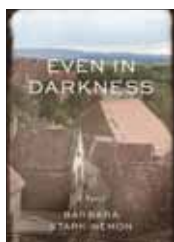

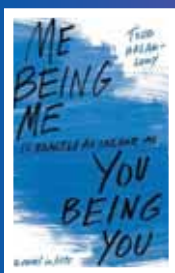

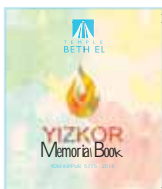
