





Temple Beth El continues to Grow & Shine!



L. Steven Weiner President of Temple Beth El 2014 – 2016

Good evening fellow congregants, clergy, friends and family. It has been my honor and privilege to serve as your President for the past two years. As my tenure comes to a close, I'm pleased to report that our beloved institution is well-staffed and moving in a positive direction. Tonight, I would like to take the opportunity to thank the people who helped me serve as President, review some of the accomplishments we've made over the past year, and talk a little bit about what the future may hold for Temple Beth El.

First, thanks to my dear wife Anne. You have provided the ultimate support system during my presidency. Not only is your intuition the best, but you have rolled up your sleeves and worked hard to assist in countless ways. I daresay your contributions have more than made up for my shortcomings! Thank you, Annie, for truly being my better half. I love you. And to my children, Emilie, Bobby and Madeline, thank you for supporting me in this adventure. I know that there have been times when Temple business superseded family obligations, so thank you for your understanding and love. I'm very proud of all three of you!

I would also like to thank the members of the Executive Committee who have supported me with wise counsel and hard work. I believe we have functioned incredibly well as a team. I am most grateful to each and every one of you for your efforts to advance our shared goals.

I would also like to specifically thank Executive Director Kim Raznik for our successful collaboration. Kim does a wonderful job in her position of building credibility with the staff and the congregation while juggling countless demands upon her time. Kim is a true gem and a cornerstone of our temple.

To Dan, Mark and Rachel, thank you for teaching me, challenging me, and respecting me. We built consensus and made decisions that were best for the institution as a whole. I must admit that I have a much deeper understanding of and respect for the challenges that you face as clergy. Thank you for helping me fulfill my obligations as President.

To the staff members of Temple Beth El, who are too numerous to mention, thank you for your diligence, your support of Mark and the team, and your willingness to befriend me. One of the best benefits of being Temple President is having the opportunity to get to know the staff. These individuals are universally committed and serve the congregation with respect and integrity. We as congregants are fortunate to have such a dedicated group to watch over our institution. Finally, I would be remiss if I did not acknowledge the support I have received from Immediate Past President Raymond Rosenfeld. Raymond mentored me in the years leading up to my presidency, and continued to provide sage advice over the past two years. Raymond, you were a tough act to follow. Although I may not have lived up to your standards, I certainly benefited from your coaching. And, to incoming President Jordon Wertheimer, thank you for your commitment to the team and your willingness to accept the challenge before you. You have worked hard to prepare for this role, and I speak on behalf of the entire Executive Committee and Board when I state that we are confident you will do a superb job leading the congregation over the next two years.

Over the last 12 months, we have made a tremendous strides of accomplishments made at Temple Beth El. We are in the midst of bolstering our security systems throughout the building thanks to securing a \$75,000 Homeland Security Grant; and we recently applied for a second grant. Our security staff



of Morris Collins, Ken Jackson, and Donzelle Graham have implemented many new programs and procedures, including practice fire drills, security lockdowns, and evacuations. Congregants, particularly parents with young children, notice and appreciate the efforts that have been made to upgrade our overall security.

We have completed the implementation of live video streaming of services and Wi-Fi

upgrades throughout the building. The Board of Trustees approved the restructuring of our temple dues, introducing an intermediate level for members ages 36 to 40. Executive Director Kim Raznik has personally spoken to or met with over 250 congregants to address their individual needs and confirm their financial commitments to the institution. Thank you, Kim, for your efforts to work with our members in a thoughtful and confidential manner.

Thanks to the generosity of the Greenspan Family, we have installed a new multipurpose playground on the northeast side of the building. It's a beautiful addition that will be enjoyed by our children for years to come. We celebrated the 165th anniversary of Temple Beth El with a glorious Gala, raising over \$25,000 and bringing together 325 congregants who enjoyed a wonderful evening of dining, dancing and entertainment. Rabbi Miller and his wife Rachel Ann led a group of 25 congregants on a memorable, 11 day sojourn to Israel. It was a



successful program that we hope to repeat again in the near future.

We also saw the creation of the Temple Beth El Caring Community, a group of trained volunteers dedicated to supporting members in times of need with compassion, respect and confidentiality. Demand for their services has grown, and why not? They perform acts of loving kindness, building community and enhancing the quality of our membership experience. Our ever popular Music Shabbat program grew and grew, with increased attendance by young and old in spiritually uplifting services. And the congregants enjoy those services in the new, more comfortable seating that you are experiencing right now!

We celebrated Cantor Rachel Gottlieb Kalmowitz's certification with a cantorial concert that was outstanding in every way. The standing room only audience experienced a Broadway caliber performance by our newly-certified Cantor, supported by our youth and adult choirs.

We conducted a new member Shabbat Dinner to welcome our newest congregants, a tradition we hope to continue on a regular basis for years to come! And we hosted over 1000 members of the community at the annual AIPAC winter community event, which featured a revealing presentation on the latest events in Israel. We recently installed a much-needed brass handrail in the sanctuary, thanks to a gift from the Jampel Family, making access to the bima more available to all.

Jan Durecki received the Leonard N. Simons History Award from the Jewish Historical Society of Michigan, in recognition of her accomplishments as the archivist at Temple Beth El. The Prentis Memorial Library was selected for the 2016 Best of Bloomfield Hills Award in the libraries category. This was a fitting tribute to Eileen Polk, our librarian, who will be retiring later this month after 14 years of dedicated service.

Over a year in the making, the congregation approved major revisions to the Bylaws to provide Temple leadership with administrative, legal and financial flexibility for the future. Programming in the last year has been outstanding. Congregants have had an incredible array of opportunities to be with their fellow members both in and out of the building. A sampling of events include the Family Seder, a women's self-defense class, movie nights, Sisterhood's Wine, Chocolate and Beer event, the Purim Carnival and the Adult Purim party, Jewishly-inspired Yoga, the Brotherhood's Speaker Series, the Woodward and Gladstone cleanup efforts, a newly formatted Glazer Institute, a successful Lawson Youth Institute, the annual road rally, hosting of the Melton School of Adult Jewish Learning, a concert by Jewish rock star Rick Recht, the Archives

"Trial of Henry Ford" event, and a visit from URJ president Rick Jacobs.

Under the leadership of Director of Education Debbie Morosohk, our educational programs have come a long way in the past year. Our Early Childhood Educator, Susie Weiner, has brought new energy and warmth to our early childhood programming. Teachers and families are engaged, the curriculum is being refined, and extended hours have made our ECC program accessible to working parents.

Our Director of Youth Engagement, Joey Unger, has reinvigorated both youth and family programming. Students and families have experienced multiple opportunities to socialize and learn together. And the Beth El Temple Youth Organization, "BETY," has been reinstituted and is making plans for a successful year ahead.

Adult education has featured familiar offerings including Shabbat Bible study and Wednesday morning Bible and Hebrew classes. This year featured new offerings as well: 13 congregants have enrolled in the Adult B'nai mitzvah class, which will conclude in the spring of 2017. There was also high demand for our outreach classes, including a Taste of Judaism in the fall and Introduction to Judaism this spring.

Many new initiatives were rolled out in the religious school. Our "Hebrew through Movement" approach to Hebrew education was well-received by our students; they told

us that they love the new program. All grades featured reimagined curriculum, new family programs, and more meaningful T'filah services for grades K through six. We debuted an all new seventh grade program, and a redesigned Monday Night School program for grades 8-10 featuring many engaging electives.

We had to say goodbye to our dear friend Rachel Rudman, who elected to enroll in rabbinic school this fall. Rachel was a tremendous asset and we will miss her energy and enthusiasm. Fortunately, we recently engaged a new Program Director, Danielle Gordon, who comes to us with years of experience in a variety of venues, including Seaholm High School, Tel Aviv University, and most recently, the Federation. Danielle will be joining us in early July, and we are confident that she will continue to build upon the successes we've experienced in programming over the past year.

Efforts to improve our financial control systems were boosted with the addition of Claire Danaher, an experienced Chief Financial Officer who has already made a substantial contribution to our team since joining us last winter. Thank you, Claire, for your diligence! Brett Panter joined us as Digital Media Coordinator, bringing an enhanced level of professionalism to our communications efforts overall.

I'm thrilled to remind you that we engaged Assistant Rabbi Megan Brudney, who will officially join us on July 1. Megan was a standout candidate and the unanimous first choice of the Rabbinic Search Committee to join Rabbi Miller, Rabbi Syme and Cantor Kalmowitz. Young, extremely bright, and energetic, Rabbi Brudney will no doubt make a very positive impact upon joining us next month. Please take advantage of the opportunity to assist in Rabbi Brudney's transition by hosting a "Meet and Mingle" with her and your friends this summer. For further information, contact (who else?) Anne Weiner.

And tomorrow evening we will celebrate Rabbi Syme's 20 years of service to Beth El and his transition to Rabbi Emeritus at a special Shabbat Dinner and Service in the sanctuary. I'm sure all of you will join me at what promises to be a most memorable event. Dan, although I will have an opportunity to address you tomorrow evening, let me take advantage of this moment to congratulate you on reaching this incredible milestone in your career. I'm sure everyone here will be joining us for what promises to be a most memorable event.

Finally, after years of planning, the board has authorized the engagement of CCS, a nationally recognized consulting firm specializing in development and fundraising. CCS is the largest fundraising consulting firm in the country and has extensive experience in designing and implementing comprehensive development plans across a wide spectrum of not-for-profit organizations, including many synagogues. Their initial task will be to complete a campaign planning assessment, helping establish financial goals, a timeline, the case for support, and the roles and responsibilities of the Clergy and the Board. This assessment will ultimately be used to develop a plan to guide Temple Beth El's fundraising efforts.

Although we are blessed with a well-managed endowment in excess of \$16 million, our dues collection represents only one third of our revenue stream, falling well below the typical 50%-60% of revenue generated by dues at most synagogues across the country. The mechanical systems in our beautiful building have reached functional obsolescence, and many of the facilities need major renovations, including Handleman Hall, the restrooms, kitchen, and classrooms.

Despite the terrific efforts of Superintendent Al Friant and his team, deferred maintenance will eventually lead to major repairs that can no longer be delayed. We have been in a deficit mode for many years, and a comprehensive capital campaign is absolutely required in order to ensure the long term financial viability of the institution. This initiative will be spearheaded by incoming President Wertheimer and Warren Rose, who will serve together as Co-Chairs of the Development Advisory Committee. You will be hearing more about this in the months ahead.

In closing, thanks to the efforts of lay leadership, Clergy and staff, we have tackled many challenges, aggressively embraced change and accomplished much in the past 12 months...but

there is more to do. Increasing membership by attracting and retaining young families, especially those with children, remains a primary goal. Implementing a successful capital campaign to both renovate the facility and bolster our endowment is equally important. And further cultivating an engaged and committed Board to lead these efforts is a requirement as well. I remain confident that we can achieve all of these goals in the future.



A very insightful man once said that our longterm success will be measured by the sense of friendship, family, learning and worship we create at Temple Beth El. I hope to have made a small contribution toward reaching the long-term success defined in that statement. Thank you again for allowing me the privilege of serving.

It's fitting that during these exciting times, Michigan's oldest congregation now has the youngest President in its 166 year history.

I would like to recognize and thank my predecessor, L. Steven Weiner, for his stewardship and unwavering commitment to Temple Beth El. Steve, on behalf of the entire congregation, I would just like to say thank you. You have graciously given so much of yourself to Temple Beth El - whether it be your time, talent or treasure. You have led by example, and you have shown me what it takes to be a successful President. We thank you – and your wife Anne – for your thoughtfulness, compassion, and dedication to Temple. Thank you.

I would like to also acknowledge and thank those members of our congregation who have served this Temple with distinction and honor, who are rotating off of the board and/or Executive Committee. The Honorable Kay Hansen, Stewart Frank, John Kessler, Lisa London, and Past President Raymond Rosenfeld. Additionally, I would like to welcome those who have accepted the challenge: our new board members - Jim Rice and Kimberly Goodman. As well as our new officers, Vice President Warren Rose and Treasurer Adam Lutz. I have also asked Todd Sable and Alex Stotland to serve as Presidential advisors to the Executive Committee. Both have accepted, and I thank them in advance for their commitment. As for the remaining members of the Board of Trustees and Executive Committee, Vice Presidents Robin Fenberg, David Folytn, and Maxine Lievois, Secretary Liz Modell, and now Immediate Past President Steve Weiner - thank you for your continued dedication, commitment and service to Beth El, where together we will navigate this congregation forward to unprecedented heights. This will not be easy - but it is up to us to meet this challenge.

Thank you to the Temple Staff and educators, led by our terrific Executive Director Kim Raznik. Thank you Debbie Morosohk, Susie Weiner and team for building a world-class school and curriculum for our children. To Claire Danaher, our new CFO. Thank you to our building's maintenance staff, our security team, all of the staff members, teachers, assistants, secretaries, and countless others who dedicate themselves to keep us running on all cylinders.

To the Rabbis and Cantors who have inspired me, guided me, and led me to this moment. Our current clergy team – Rabbi Mark Miller, Rabbi Daniel Syme, Rabbi Megan Brudney, and Cantor Rachel Gottlieb Kalmowitz – thank you for being our spiritual conscience. For guiding us through life's highs and lows with reverence, respect, worship, and friendship. To those Rabbis who came before you – Rabbi Julian Cook, who confirmed me; Rabbi Daniel Polish, who Bar Mitzvah'd me; and most importantly, Rabbi Richard C. Hertz, my grandfather – whose voice and spirit live on, not just within me, but within these walls at Temple Beth El. My grandfather died when I was 19 years old – but his commitment and passion for Judaism and our Jewish people live inside me. His words – and voice – inspire me. He would be proud today, and I ask that he watch over us, bless us – our beloved Beth El.

Being a 4th generation member, I would like to thank my family – all of whom are here this evening. My parents, brother, sister, spouses, mother and father in-law, and my grandparents, of blessed memory – whose



presence I feel when I walk through these halls and sit in our magnificent sanctuary. But most importantly, my beautiful wife Alex – and our newest addition, Everly. Thank you Alex for always standing beside me, supporting me, and encouraging me to always be my best. You are my partner on this journey through life, and I promise to you now in front of the entire congregation that you and our family will always come first – and that I will love and support you every day, as you have supported me. I am so grateful to you, and I love you.

I promised that I would keep this short, but I would like to take a moment and offer a heartfelt Yasher Koach to Rabbi Megan Brudney, who will join us for the very first time tomorrow evening. I was honored to chair the committee, alongside my dear friend Cheryl Kerwin, which brought Rabbi Brudney to Temple Beth El. We started the search for an Assistant Rabbi back in November 2013. Cheryl and I



interviewed, along with Rabbi Miller, more than a dozen Rabbis currently in the field and over 30 student Rabbis graduating from the Hebrew Union College. Rabbi Brudney, we welcome you and hope this is the start of a long and fulfilling career here at Temple Beth El.

And speaking of long and fulfilling – Rabbi Syme. I have the honor and privilege of saying a few words at tomorrow's Shabbat service honoring Rabbi Syme's 20 years of leadership at Temple Beth El, as he becomes just our 3rd Rabbi Emeritus in our 166 year history. Rabbi Syme has served our congregation with honor and distinction these past 20 years. He has been our advisor and our advocate during life's good times and bad – and on behalf of the congregation, we thank him and Jill, for dedicating themselves to our needs over their own, and look forward to celebrating this momentous occasion with them. Thank you, Rabbi Daniel Syme.

President Theodore Roosevelt once said, "People ask the difference between a leader and a boss. The leader leads, and the boss drives." I am not here to be the boss. We have a tremendous clergy team and staff to drive – to handle the day to day, ins and outs of our Temple. Those looking to see me on the bima every Shabbat will be disappointed. While I applaud my predecessors for doing that – my life still consists of night feedings.

But I've had time to reflect on my goals as our President, and I believe that my mission during these next two years is a simple one, yet, perhaps the most challenging. One that has eluded us far too long. It is on me, our clergy, this elected group of officers and trustees, and our congregants, to protect, secure, and endow the future of Temple Beth El. We must honor those who have come before us, by safeguarding what they have entrusted in our keeping. Each of us, as members of this distinguished and historic congregation, have an obligation to do our part. Being a legacy here at Temple Beth El, a multi-generational member, means we need to continue what our mothers and fathers – grandmothers and grandfathers, aunts and uncles – did during their time here. We must do as they did. Be mindful and watch over our beloved Beth El.

I am pleased to announce that under my Presidency, with the help of many, Temple Beth El will embark on its largest and most comprehensive fundraising initiative since the erecting of this very building. What Past Presidents Bob Canvasser and Marvin Goldman did in the late 1960s and early 1970s - we must do again today. We can no longer ignore the needs of this substantial and magnificent Yamasaki building (the same architect who designed the original World Trade Center in New York) – this is a nationally known and renowned building, and we must bring it into the 21st century. We can no longer ignore the trends, not just here at Temple Beth El, but nationally, where dues paying membership is down, participation, involvement and association is down, and there is growing apathy. The Pew Research Center's report titled, 'A Portrait of Jewish Americans' written in 2013 says so. Our task it to preserve Beth El's future – now. So that we can provide the programming needs, educational needs, and spiritual needs of our changing community. The answer isn't to make cuts; rather, we must grow. Grow our standing in the community, grow our membership, grow our school, and grow fresh ideas - out of the box ideas that might feel uncomfortable, but will connect with our consumer. We must grow our endowment. The Torah teaches us that the Jewish People must do what we can for our own, and for our people Israel - and at Temple Beth El, we stand united, side by side, with Israel.

It is not just an obligation, but an honor and privilege to give back and protect our people. To protect and secure our beloved Beth El. I applaud our efforts in the past – including the creation of the 1850s Society, which recognizes Temple members who willfully and graciously include Temple Beth El in their estate plan, or the Double Minyan that Rabbi Syme oversaw when he became our Rabbi 20 years ago – but more is needed to be done, and it's up to us to do it.

During my early high school years, I was profoundly interested in President John F. Kennedy. It's easy to understand why a young person would be drawn to our nation's 35th President. He was young, vibrant, full of new ideas, wasn't part of the status quo, spoke differently than those before him, and was idealistic. He inspired many of that era to reach for goals that were otherwise unobtainable. When he said in September, 1962 that America will put a man on the moon by the end of the decade, he challenged what people thought was possible.

Here at Temple Beth El, we can take a page from the Kennedy script. Some of the finest Jewish congregations throughout the entire United States are located right here, in southeastern Michigan. But growing up, it was known that when affairs of the Jewish people were in the news, you turned to Temple Beth El for a response. This was the standard built by Rabbi Franklin, continued by Rabbi Glazer, and fostered under Rabbi Hertz. Temple Beth El was that shining city upon a hill. But we took ourselves for granted - we took our congregants for granted. And along the way, lost some of our idealism. Mother Teresa famously once said, "Yesterday is gone. Tomorrow has not yet come. We have only today. Let us Begin."






