CLERGY COLUMN



Although we may not always think of it this way, our High Holy Day season is filled with great drama. Our tradition envisions God seated on a grand throne, presiding as heavenly Judge over a court of ministering angels. The heavens provide the backdrop of a courtroom, and each of us is called to answer for our actions over the previous year – with final judgment “sealed” in the Book of Life!

The key, however – and the reason we can enter the holiday season with confidence rather than fear – is that we are not mere defendants, awaiting our fate. Instead, we have been given the means to determine our own destiny. No matter what the previous year has brought, the High Holy Days encourage us to enter with intention and thought ... just as we would any secular courtroom.

The preparation begins with “Cheshbon ha-Nefesh” – looking inward to take an “accounting of our soul.” The entire month of Elul, leading up to Rosh HaShanah, is intended for this purpose – and traditionally, the shofar is sounded each morning as a reminder for us to take at least a few moments to think about what we have accomplished well, where we have struggled, and how we could have done better.

Just as important, we gather on a Saturday evening (this year on September 16) for an evening of Selichot (forgiveness). Here at Temple, it is a wonderful night that will include a program on how to “Thrive” in times of transition (including entering a new year) at 7:00 pm, followed by a beautiful service in the Chapel at 9:30 pm.

If we take advantage of these opportunities, by the time Rosh HaShanah begins, we will be prepared to embrace the awesome power that can pervade our majestic Sanctuary when the curtain symbolically rises on the dramatic final scenes that we hope will lead us into a New Year filled with strengthened relationships, deeper connections to our community, and a pervasive sense of joy and peace across all we hope to accomplish.

On opening day, I walked many first-time campers to their bunks and saw them visibly relax when their counselors yelled out their names and welcomed them into the bunk with huge hugs. GUCI's senior staff and administration modeled this warm behavior that made me feel so at home at GUCI as well.

I can't wait to return to GUCI next summer and am also eagerly awaiting my upcoming trip to Tamarack in just a few weeks. Jewish summer camp is so important to building Jewish identity, and we at TBE are happy to help you find the perfect fit for your camper!

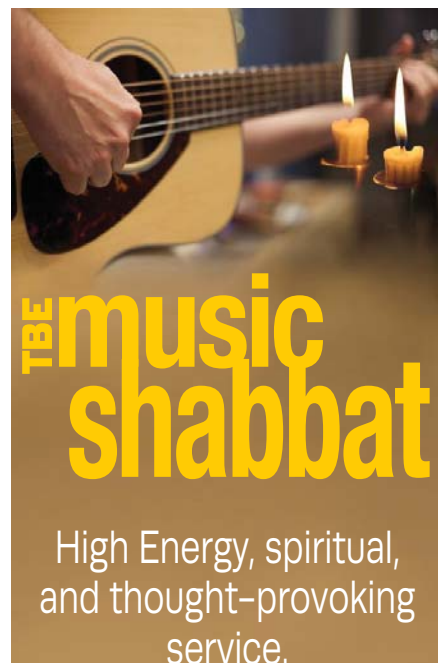

I would also like to recognize some of our lay-leaders, who volunteer and have gone above and beyond the call of duty, to make sure our kids' experience at Temple Beth El is a positive one. This past year at Temple Beth El has been an exciting one – the night after I was installed as President, we celebrated the achievements of Rabbi Dan Syme, as we honored him becoming our Rabbi Emeritus – only the third in our Temple's 167-year history, joining Rabbi Franklin and Rabbi Hertz.

The following week, Rabbi Megan Brudney officially joined our clergy team. Rabbi Brudney has brought, how do I put this – liveliness – to our bima. Rabbi Brudney has become, in just one year's time, an absolute treasure here at Temple Beth El – beloved by

our congregants. We are lucky and honored to have her as our Rabbi, and we hope she makes a permanent home here in metro-Detroit. On a personal note, as the co-chair of the Rabbinic Search Committee with my friend Cheryl Kerwin, finding Rabbi Brudney was not easy. We interviewed more than 50 rabbinic candidates over a two-year period, traveling from Detroit to Los Angeles and then New York, determined to find the perfect fit for our magnificent Temple Beth El. Megan, after we met you in New York, we knew immediately you were meant to be here. Thank you for agreeing to be a part of our family.

In September, Cantor Kalmowitz was invited and sang the National Anthem at a Detroit Tigers game.

In January, Temple Beth El welcomed legendary jurist and author, Professor Alan Dershowitz. Because of the generosity of Temple members Ed Levy and Linda Dresner, Jim and Nancy Grosfeld, Bobby and Julie Taubman, Burt and Suzy Farbman, Warren and Carol Ann Rose, David and Rose Handleman, and Walter and Marilyn Wolpin – this "sold-out" event was free to the community, and over 1,300 people were able to participate with one of our nation's
