Avi Issacharoff, *The Times of Israel's* Middle East analyst, fills the same role for *Walla*, the leading portal in Israel.

He is also a guest commentator on many different radio shows and current affairs programs on television. Until 2012, he was a reporter and commentator on Arab affairs for the *Haaretz* newspaper. He also lectures on modern Palestinian history at Tel Aviv

University, and is currently writing a script for an action-drama series for the Israeli satellite Television "YES."

Born in Jerusalem, he graduated cum laude from Ben Gurion University with a B.A. in Middle Eastern studies and then earned his M.A. from Tel Aviv University on the same subject, also cum laude.

A fluent Arabic speaker, Avi was the Middle East Affairs correspondent for Israeli Public Radio covering the Israeli-Palestinian conflict, the war in Iraq

and the Arab countries between the years 2003-2006.

In 2002 he won the "best reporter" award for the "Israel Radio" for his coverage of the second intifada.

In 2004, together with Amos Harel, he wrote "The Seventh War - How we won and why we lost the war with the Palestinians." A year later the book won an award from the Institute for Strategic Studies for containing the best research on security affairs in Israel. In 2008, Issacharoff and Harel published their second book, entitled "34 Days - The Story of the Second Lebanon War," which won the same prize.

Avi created and wrote an action-drama series named 'Fauda' (chaos in Arabic) that was Israel's most popular television show in 2014. The show tells the story of an undercover elite Israeli unit and their attempts to arrest or kill Hamas' number one terrorist in the West Bank. *Fauda* was described by the critics in Israel as "the best action-thriller show that was ever made in Israel".

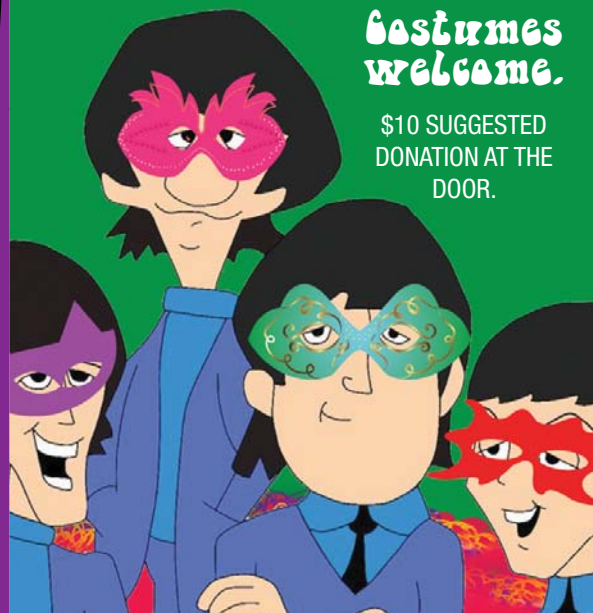

JEWISH WAR VETERANS MEMORIAL WALL INSTALLATION

On Sunday, November 29, 2015, the Jewish War Veterans – Department of Michigan marked the installation of the Memorial Wall which was moved from the Jewish Community Center in Oak Park to its new home at the Holocaust Center in Farmington Hills. At the invitation of Department Commander Larry Barry, I attended the event. Archive's volunteer Andrea Gallucci joined me there. After opening remarks by the Center's Executive Director Stephen Goldman, Commander Barry and others, we adjourned to a hallway where the Wall is now located. It was covered with camouflage netting and after some brief prayers and a soulful rendition of "Taps," the net was removed. It was a brief ceremony that marked the Memorial Wall's change of location in a dignified manner.

The Wall is an assemblage of photographs of Jewish service personnel from Michigan who were killed during World War II. Hopefully, the visual and emotional impact of this portrait gallery will remind those who view it of the tremendous loss of life and the corresponding lost promise and potential that would have benefitted both the Jewish and greater Detroit communities. While we never take these things for granted, it

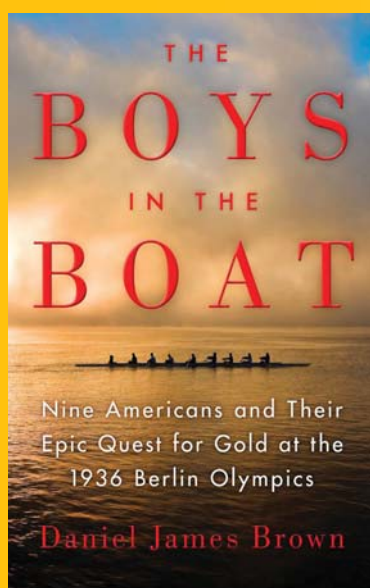


is good to purposefully stop and remember the sacrifices that were made by these men and their families.

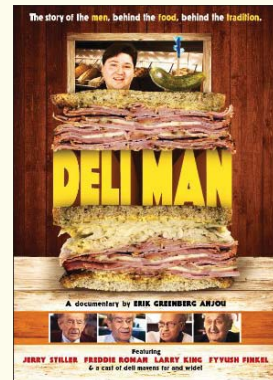

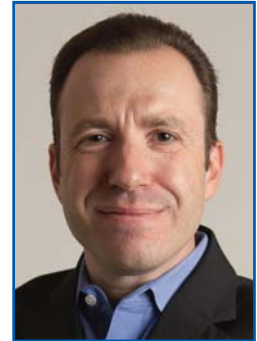
