INTRODUCTION TO JUDAISM



Lights, Camera, Action – Jewish connections to Michigan's Motion Picture & Commercial Film Industry

My recent Lights, Camera, Action presentation focused upon three areas: Film Exchange businesses, theatre ownership and architecture, and commercial companies specifically Ford Motor Company's Educational Weeklies, the Jam Handy Corporation, and the Metropolitan Motion Picture Company. The importance of the Film Exchange business to Michigan's early film industry has been largely forgotten. Located in Detroit, these companies were responsible for distributing mvoies throughout the state. They operated out of fire proof buildings that were designed to mitigate the dangers highly flammable nitrate film. During our research we found that the majority of these companies were Jewish - owned, often by members of TBE. Also overlooked has been the important part that Detroit played in the commercial film industry – largely driven by the growth of the automobile industry. The Metropolitan Motion Picture Company was owned by two members of the congregation: Maurice J. and Arthur A. Caplan. Maurice and his wife Louise Van Baalen Caplan did not have any children. Arthur Caplan was married to Rose. Their children were David (Carole), Stanley (Tobi) and Rhoda Lou (Ben) Aronsohn. Stanley and Tobi's children are Arthur (Frances) and Laura Ann (Clifford) Deremo. Arthur and Rose's grandchildren are Nancy, Jane and Arthur Caplan, Isabelle Aronsohn and Laura Deremo.

After Arthur's death (1942), Rose widow married Abraham Hayden in 1946. Rose and Abraham were involved with Metropolitan Motion Picture Company until 1953. It appears that the company was dissolved in 1954. At this time, we have been unable to locate any of the company's records. Maurice and Arthur were visionaries in commercial film production and there story is certainly worth further exploration and preservation. 
