

Our Commitment to Judaism





Shalom l'kulam—greetings everyone. Back in November I had the chance to visit Israel on a trip sponsored jointly through the Hebrew Union College (our Reform Movement's seminary) and Israel's Foreign Ministry. The trip brought seventeen recently ordained Reform rabbis and cantors to Jerusalem to explore contemporary Israeli society and how it has changed (and stayed the same) since we lived in Israel in 2010, 2011, and 2012. In our small group we met with members of Knesset (Ahmed Tibi of the United Arab List, Sharren Haskel of Likud, and Michal Biran of Labor), Orthodox rabbis, Palestinian activists, an Ethiopian-Jewish organizer, Jewish educators, diplomats, graffiti artists, experts in Israeli demographics, and more. Many of our speakers painted an optimistic portrait of Israel in terms of both domestic and foreign policy and cooperation.

Perhaps the most exciting group that we met with, however, consisted of representatives of HUC's Israeli rabbinic program, which is housed on our Jerusalem campus and offers a course of rabbinic study targeted toward Israelis. Contrary to the reports we usually hear, these administrators, rabbis, and rabbinic students described a thriving Israeli Reform movement. A movement with forty-five year round pulpits and sixty high holy day pulpits; a movement with a growing number of preschools with burgeoning enrollment; a movement that will next year ordain its one hundredth rabbi; a movement that has won key legal battles for acceptance in the state of Israel. The movement does continue to fight for recognition—and terrible threats leveled against key Reform leaders made the news several weeks ago—but alongside the news of perpetual struggle comes news of considerable gains.

I can only imagine that those gains will continue. We attended the ordination ceremony for five new Israeli rabbis and observed with some surprise the diversity in the audience that assembled. Not only did all kinds of spectators gather, but several people from across the denominational spectrum accepted degrees from HUC's non-rabbinic programs (focusing on pastoral counseling and pluralistic Jewish education). As more Israelis come in contact with HUC, its rabbis, and its other representatives in the field, so will they have the chance to discover Reform Judaism not through news articles of clashes and discord—but rather through moments of meaningful personal encounter.

I am delighted to have returned home to TBE and cannot wait for my next opportunity to return to our beautiful and complicated Jewish state!

Look What's Cookin'



Look What's Cookin' is a new column written by TBE member Jorin Rubin who will periodically review new and exciting restaurants in Detroit.

When my parents visited from Florida, we decided to take them to one of my favorite new restaurants in Detroit, Grey Ghost. Reservations are a great convenience there as I did not want to make my folks wait. Grey Ghost exemplifies the epicurean cultural shift from meat and potatoes to meat and craft cocktails. With high ceilings, exposed pipes, plenty of brick and leather, the atmosphere is hip industrial chic at its finest.

The restaurant is located at 47 East Watson Street, the former location of Ye Olde butcher Shoppe in the Midtown section of Detroit. Getting there from the 248 is easy enough; M10 to the Forest Warren exit to Woodward. It's right off Woodward. As far as the parking, it's street parking and so far, we have been able to park on Watson, among the high end SUVs.

I prepared my parents for noise and "interesting" menu choices. My mother promised she would not ask for any food substitutions. They easily embraced the Detroit scene despite its sharp contract to the dining room in their retirement community. Once inside, we were treated to a vibrant bar scene and a crowd that varied widely in age and hipness. Although it was a little loud and some of the tables for two are close together, we all seemed to get used to the tempo with minimal kvetching.



The wait staff was knowledgeable, attentive and enthusiastic. Even though it's a meatcentric place (their website invites you with the pun "we can't wait to meat you") there are vegetarian and seafood options. For us, the star of the show was the fried bologna on a waffle with sharp cheddar and jalapeno. Sharing it among four people was a little dicey. Ribs, yellowfin tuna, and a double cheeseburger were all great. We enjoyed the creative sundaes for dessert. As we left, my mother said, "It was great, I don't like to complain, but an early bird special would have been nice."

ast year my husband and I received an email asking if we wanted to participate in a "Giving Circle" with five other couples. We knew nothing about it except that we would be meeting once a month, we would be asked to host one meeting, and at the end of our experience we would be required to donate \$180 per person to a charity. Having very few friends in the Metro Detroit area, and wanting to expand our social circle, we hesitantly said ok. Our first meeting was held at one of the couples' houses – we drank wine, had a potluck dinner, and spoke about our previous experiences with philanthropy. Over the course of six months, our group continued to meet. We discussed what was important to us in a charitable organization, what types of causes we wanted to focus on, and developed a vision and mission statement. Ultimately, our small group donated \$1,568 to Forgotten Harvest, and came away with not only new friends, but knowledge about our community's resources.

Why am I telling you this? Even though I think of myself as a charitable person (adopting a family during the holidays, volunteering my time in the community), this experience was unlike any other. Our Giving Circle forced my husband and me to think, examine ourselves, and learn. In today's technical age, donating money has become as easy as a click of a button. We go to a website, "click here," type in an amount we want to give, and press "submit" – many times without even having to take a credit card out of our wallets, thanks to servers that store our information. Donations require little time or effort. But there was a time, as recently as 5-10 years ago, when donations meant more, when tangible items were collected, and time and thought was required. By no means am I saying donating money is a bad thing! On the contrary, there are many organizations that depend on the generosity of monetary gifts. What I am suggesting is that philanthropy can have even more meaning when it is combined with more learning and intent.

In an effort to increase our collective involvement in philanthropy, I am pleased to announce a new Temple initiative: TBE's Giving Tree. Starting in January, you will see a nice collections area by the Chapel entrance, with bright signs describing this project. Every month, one of our diverse groups at Temple (such as the Brotherhood, Women of TBE, ECC parents, etc) will choose an organization that is in need of tangible goods. We will highlight our Temple group and publicize the organization's mission and the items to be collected. Whenever you enter the building, we hope you will take a minute to learn about our partner organizations, and contribute whatever item(s) you can. Together, we will demonstrate the value of intentional tzedakah and tikkun olam.

Why a tree? It is a perfect symbol to portray growth, the importance of a community, how everyone is needed to make something thrive, and that Our Spirit is Growing. Together, let's help others grow as well!


Monthly Mishpachah


