
need to pause, and remember.




Operationally Speaking...

Without question, safety and security are two personal priorities for me; not only in my role as Executive Director, but in my personal life as well. I tend to count the rows between me and the nearest exit, I never enter a business when the Brinks truck is there, and I always look for potential lockdown and evacuation options in public places. I imagine it sounds like a bit much, but to me, it's part of my daily routine - not only here, but with other security professionals in the Jewish community.

Security Professionals

That said, keeping people safe in a 185-thousand square foot facility is no small task. It takes a competent staff, routine drills, and new technology. At TBE, we are fortunate to have all three. Thanks to Morris Collins and his security team of Ken Jackson and Donzelle Graham, we are covered from open to close with highly trained and dedicated professionals. Collectively they have almost 100 years of protective service experience. Morris regularly conducts evacuation, lockdown, and shelter-in-place drills for the entire building population. We constantly discuss best practices and ways to improve our communication and emergency response.



Security Upgrades

As you may know, we were awarded a 75 thousand dollar Homeland Security Grant in 2015 for target hardening. Based on security assessments from local law enforcement and JFMD Security Director Gary Sikorsky, we are focusing on intrusion control, camera surveillance, and video/intercom remote access. When the security upgrades are complete, you will be able to enter through the Sanctuary entrance as well as the North entrance by communicating with the Chapel security reception desk via an intercom & camera. Also, we are installing dozens of surveillance cameras, screening monitors, and recording devices in hopes of never having to use them.

Under the supervision of TBE IT Specialist Matt Hammond, Security 101 is finishing up installation of the new technology and looking to begin training and implementation by month's end.

I am happy to share we have been awarded a second 75 thousand dollar Homeland Security Grant for 2016, which will go toward additional target harding.







In these past few months, we have celebrated many milestones and achievements. In May, Rachel Kalmowitz, upon her graduation from the Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion, became a certified Cantor. In June, we celebrated Rabbi Syme's 20 years of Rabbinic Leadership as he became our Rabbi Emeritus – just the 3rd Emeritus Rabbi in our congregation's 166 year history. Since 2014, Rabbi Mark Miller

has been our Senior Rabbi; leading us into an exciting future - bringing with him Rabbi Megan Brudney, our newest clergy addition, who joined our Temple this past July.

John F. Kennedy once said, "Change is the law of life. And those who look only to the past or present are certain to miss the future." With Rabbi Miller, Rabbi Brudney, and Cantor Kalmowitz - our future is bright. Like the city of Detroit, Temple Beth El is a blank canvas; ready and eager to be shaped and molded, open to innovating new and exciting ideas - out of the box ideas that will push the boundaries of what we thought was possible in order to grow. Grow our culture. Grow our standing in the community. Grow our membership. Grow our programming. Grow our school. To be the standard built by Rabbi Franklin, continued by Rabbi Glazer, and fostered under Rabbi Hertz.

I am proud to stand here on behalf of our Temple, to help guide this sacred institution into the future. And there is much to be proud of, as we head together towards the future there is so much here that Temple can provide for you and your families. Our warm and inviting services, our musical Shabbats, where it's literally standing room only. Our caring and dedicated clergy, who are here for all of us, in times of joy and sorrow. Temple Beth El can be such a rewarding piece in your life - it reminds me of a book I used to read as a kid - a book many of us have read, over and over again. It's called 'The Giving Tree' by Shel Silverstein. It's about a tree that loved this little boy and the boy loved this tree right back. As a little boy, he would visit the tree every day, gather her leaves, climb up her trunk, eat her apples, swing from her branches. As the boy got older, he came to the tree less and less - but whenever the tree saw the boy, she was happy. When the boy was a young man, she encouraged him to take her apples and sell them so the boy would have some money. As the boy aged, the tree encouraged him to cut off her branches and build a house. When the boy wanted a boat - the tree encouraged him to cut her trunk and build a boat. Time passed, and the boy returned, now an old man. The tree had nothing left to give. The old man looked at the tree, and asked if he could just sit there and rest quietly. And the boy did - and the tree was happy.

Throughout life, we all use Temple Beth El differently; sometimes more when our kids are young, and less once they are out of the house - but no matter what - Temple Beth El will always be here for you - will always be here for your family - and we will be happy.

Reading that story to my daughter reminded me of a proverb that teaches us that, "the best

time to plant a tree was 20 years ago. The 2nd best time is today."

SO WHAT CAN WE DO TODAY - THAT TOMORROW?

Just this past month, our Executive Committee received the results of a study that will help us deter-

mine the possibility of a comprehensive capital campaign for our Temple. It would include architectural and building updates, the growing of our endowment, the creation of Rabbinic & Cantorial chairs, and a concentrated effort on planned giving. This survey, conducted by a leading strategic fundraising and development group, named CCS, gave us a lot of insight about who we are as a Temple community, and what we're looking for as we head towards the future.

For me, the goal is to protect, secure and endow the future of Temple Beth El. We must honor those who have come before us, by safeguarding what they have entrusted in our keeping. Each of us, as members of this distinguished and historic congregation, have an obligation to do our part. Being a legacy here at Temple Beth El, a multi-generational member, means that we need to continue what our mothers and fathers, grandmothers and grandfathers, aunts and uncles did during their time here. Temple Beth El had several campers at GUCI last summer and we hope to have many more in 2017. Please consider giving your child the gift of this extraordinary Jewish camp experience.




