ECC's New Natural Outdoor Play Space is Underway!

The Early Childhood Center is ecstatic to announce that we have received a generous gift from Jill Greenspan Gun and her family, in loving memory of her father Fred E. Greenspan, to make a natural outdoor play space. Mr. Greenspan grew up in Huntington Woods, but many of his Jewish and life-long friendships began at TBE. One of the playground experiences is a custom double-decker tree house where the kids can explore and play. All of the new play pieces are made from nature-based materials and will allow children to play in a hands-on imaginative way.

And on the east side, the exploration wall along the fence has movable funnels and water wheels so each child can use it how they imagine it. SAPIRO v FORD

More than 500 people attended Carol King's presentation "The Trial of Henry Ford," on September 9 at TBE.

Our guest speaker, producer Carol King, shared with attendees the story of attorney Aaron Sapiro and the libel lawsuit he pursued against Henry Ford. Sapiro's activities organizing West Coast and Canadian farmers into cooperative associations came to Ford's attention during the early 1920s. Ford used his newspaper, *The Dearborn Independent*, and mounted a smear campaign against Sapiro. Carol said that a recurring question she is frequently asked, is "Why did Ford, headquartered in Detroit, care about Sapiro's organizing activities that were taking place thousands of miles away?" The answer is that Ford viewed himself as the champion of rural America and viewed Sapiro's activities as a Jewish plot to take advantage of the American farmer. Carol also described Aaron's hardscrabble

childhood that shaped his character as a crusader against social injustice. Carol predicts that the upcoming documentary she and her husband Michael Rose, of Michael Rose Productions, are producing about the trial, will be completed at the conclusion of 2016. Carol was careful to differentiate between the current Ford family's many outreach activities within the Jewish community and the actions of their ancestor.

Carol appeared as this year's Mary Einstein Shapero Memorial Lecture speaker. The series was begun in 2007 by the Honorable Walter Shapero in memory of his late wife, Mary. Each year, we bring to Temple Beth El, a lecturer who discusses Jewish connections to, or influences upon, national or international events. Preparations for the series involve many months of work.
