CLERGY COLUMN

A MESSAGE FROM RABBI BRUDNEY



Shalom and a happy 5778 to our entire TBE family! It was wonderful spending so much time with you over the last few weeks. After all of the high intensity praying and sanctuary time of Rosh HaShanah and Yom Kippur, we are excited to be heading outdoors now in anticipation of the festival of Sukkot. I hope that many of you will join us in some of the events in our TBE sukkah.

A sukkah is, by design, a vulnerable and exposed structure. The roof should be highly permeable,

letting in sunlight and breezes (preferable) as well as rain or even...snow (not). Most people do not enjoy sitting in inclement weather. As Jews living in Michigan's unpredictable weather, then, where are we supposed to draw the line? The rabbis of old offer this guidance in Mishnah Sukkah 2:9: "When rain is falling, at what point may one leave the sukkah? When a cooked dish [that is easily spoiled by water] is ruined [by the rain]." I love the simple practicality of both the advice and the measurement itself. No references to obscure units, no painstaking collection of environmental data—just a judgment call that even a child could make.

More than the letter of this specific ruling, however, I love the can-do spirit of it. The rabbis tell us that we should not give up immediately (i.e. due to three isolated raindrops) if our plans seem to go awry—but neither do we need to sit and suffer through an experience that was not in fact intended to inflict pain. Moreover, though, by using personal preference as the measuring stick for when to give up, the rabbis encourage us and empower us to take our Judaism into our own hands. On the topic of a rainy Sukkot day, then, there is no higher authority than oneself!

What a beautiful, multi-pronged message as we start our new year: Judaism should be accessible. We should not immediately be deterred from engaging with our Judaism. Judaism should not cause extreme discomfort. And, with just a bit of training, we are all eminently capable of taking control of our own experience with our faith.

HARVEST FESTIVAL

DID YOU KNOW?

Sukkot is a harvest festival arriving in autumn, right after the Jewish New Year, that lasts seven days. Sukkot reminds us of the ancient Jewish people's escape from Egypt, when they lived in temporary shelters, which is why the holiday is also known as the Festival of Booths. It's traditional to build a sukkah, a temporary booth or hut, in which to gather, eat meals, sing, talk - even sleep, if the weather permits! A sukkah often has only three walls, leaving one side open to guests, and the top is covered loosely with greenery - thickly enough to be shaded from the sun during the day, but sparsely enough to see the stars at night. Some families decorate their sukkah with lights, streamers, and seasonal fruits; others take a minimal approach and leave their sukkah unadorned.

During the holiday, it is traditional to perform the ritual of the Four Species. One holds together the Lulav (a bundle of myrtle, willow, and palm fronds) and an Etrog (a citron) and waves them north, south, east, and west, and up and down. It's a mitzvah to perform this ritual during Sukkot. It's also a mitzvah to welcome guests into your sukkah.

At the end of Sukkot comes another joyous Jewish holiday: Simchat Torah ("celebration of the Torah"), which marks the completion of the annual cycle of the reading of the Torah. Each week in synagogue, Jews around the world publicly read the same Torah portions, starting with the first chapter of Genesis and working up to the final chapter of Deuteronomy. On Simchat Torah, the last chapter of Deuteronomy is read aloud; immediately after that the first chapter of Genesis is read again - so the Torah both ends and starts, a never-ending circle.









NO NEED TO WAIT



The first thing I was told about my soon-to-be brother in law was that he had the most unique, obnoxious, and hilarious laugh. I could not wait to meet Alex. He adhered to his Russian roots, exemplifying cultural stereotypes: he drank vodka like a fish, he worked hard but played much harder, and most of all, he loved furiously.

I will never forget the afternoon of October 9th. Five days after returning from my honeymoon, I came home from work to find a troubling look on my husband's face. I knew something was wrong. I soon learned that Alex was not answering his phone, nor had he shown up for work that day. Several hours of searching passed and then we learned that, at age 34, Alex had passed away. He left behind a then-pregnant wife, a son, a bright career, and countless loved ones, family and friends alike.

I share this story not to evoke sadness, but rather to incite inspiration and provide

much-needed reminders to myself as well as our community. It has been nearly two years since Alex has been gone. Over that time, my family has undergone a period of tremendous growth. In the past, we would mostly gather for special occasions, whether they were holidays, celebrations, or grievous events. Now, however, we do not need a special occasion to be together and to cherish each other's company. So often, people require a specific event to meet, a reason to congregate, a special date on the calendar to come together and laugh or cry. Alex's passing reminded us that every day is a special day that can serve this purpose. While it is also important to recognize special occasions, we do not need to wait for a mark on the calendar to celebrate each other.

It is my hope that Rosh HaShanah and Yom Kippur have provided meaningful opportunities for reflection. This holiday season officially ends with the celebrations of Sukkot and Simchat Torah. We hope you will join your Temple Family for these October events, as well as several other programs we have planned. But despite the technical end of the holiday season, we hope you will continue to join us whenever you would

like. Our new foyer provides a great space to relax, enjoy some coffee, catch up on work, spend time with friends, or play a game of cards. We do not need to wait for a reason to enjoy this wonderful space and community.

Not because you have to, or because there is a birthday, a holiday, or a shiva, but because we are here. We exist together. As we say on Simchat Torah at the completion of the Torah, "Chazak, chazak, venit'chazek": be strong, be strong, and let us strengthen one another.


