#### A MESSAGE FROM CANTOR RACHEL



### The Space Between

As I sat down to write this article, I started to think about what would be happening in October. Since we at TBE are currently zooming towards the High Holy Days, it seems impossible to imagine that they will be over by October, but they will. So, are there other big holidays coming up? Not until Thanksgiving, really. So, then, what will be going on at Temple that people might care about? Just our usual everyday activities – the stuff between the big holidays.

There is a Dave Matthews song called, "The Space Between," and it made me think. Don't we live most of the moments of our lives in the space between? Between birthdays and holidays, between life cycle events and trips. The walk down the street on a sunny day. The laughter of your child, as you play. The dancing in the kitchen as you do the dishes. (Or is that just in my family?)

It is said that when Moses received the Ten Commandments, they were written in black fire on white fire, and that both of these fires were meant to be read and interpreted. Thus, the white space surrounding the black letters in the Torah are just as important as the letters themselves, and just as essential. According to the Talmud, every letter in the Torah must have white space around it, or the Torah is unusable. Reading the Torah only for what it says has limited utility. It is when we interpret and discuss it that it truly comes to life. In the same way, if all that we offered at temple were the major holidays and life cycle events, we could not be a part of your daily lives and our efficacy would be limited.

Here are some examples (not an exhaustive list) of what is going on at temple in October, which you will find throughout the year:

- Monday evenings: Masa Teens (our newly renamed education program for 8th-12th grade.)
- Tuesday mornings: volunteers give of their time in our Braille Bindery.
- Tuesday evenings: TBE Choir rehearsals (do you love to sing? Email me and let me know you'd like to join us!)
- Wednesday afternoons: B'nai Mitzvah
   Club (for 5th and 6th graders to begin
   preparing to become a Bar or Bat
   Mitzvah, as well as for 7th graders
   to work with our B'nai Mitzvah
   Coordinator or the Clergy.)
- Wednesday evenings: Adult B'nai Mitzvah and other Adult Education opportunities.
- Thursday evenings: these vary, but in October they include the first installment of an Interfaith series that we are presenting with Christ Church Cranbrook and the Muslim Unity Center, to bring a deeper understanding between our faiths, a Board of Trustees meeting, and a Fused Glass candlestick project.
- Friday mornings: ECC Shabbat, led by a member of our clergy team or our Education Director. If you ever want to lift your spirits, stop by the Chapel between 10:30 and 11am any Friday morning.
- Friday evenings: 7pm Shabbat services. Did you enjoy being a part of our HHD

- services? We do this Every Week! We would love to see you become a "Shabbat regular."
- Saturday mornings: 10:30am Shabbat services. Fridays are too difficult? Come Saturday mornings!

In the mix, there are also meetings of our Executive Committee, our Board of Trustees, and many different committee and affiliate meetings. We have B'nai Mitzvah meetings, tutoring, and rehearsals. And all of this is in addition to 123 1-5 year olds coming into our building every weekday to be educated in our outstanding Early Childhood Center.

As you see, our space between is anything but empty. In the Torah, another way that space is used is to separate its sections. The sages said that the extra space was given by God to Moses to give him time to reflect and absorb the previous lesson. So, although I hope that your High Holy Days here at temple took you to new spiritual heights, and that you felt a sense of joy and purpose as they ended, I now entreat you to come to Beth El to experience the space between.



PRESIDENT'S REMARKS

I want to take a moment to express my gratitude and appreciation for Temple Beth El's Clergy, Staff, and Lay Leaders (which I refer to as "Team TBE.") I also want to extend a warm welcome to the latest Team TBE addition, Daniel Mesa, our New Executive Director. Everybody on Team TBE works diligently to put a modern twist on our historic Temple. We have so many exciting things happening here every day. Temple Beth El is thriving and I couldn't be more proud to be your 70th President!

This is such a busy time of year ... but I always wonder, why is that? Why, with all our modern conveniences that are supposed to save time, are we still so busy? With a click of a button you can order anything, and have it delivered right to your door. No need to go to the bookstore or even to the supermarket. You don't even have to waste time driving and parking: Just take an Uber! Yet even with all these timesavers we seem to have less and less of exactly that which we're trying so desperately to safeguard, our free time.

This season is especially hectic for my family. Recently my husband J.J. and I packed and moved two of our kids, Ruby and Lacey, up to the University of Michigan. And for our other two, Skylar and Nathan, we were busy buying school supplies and new clothes, and attending various Curriculum Nights, and Ice Cream Socials. Autumn also means covering lawn furniture, cleaning out flower beds and, of course, let's not forget that it's football season!

Like most families, ours is in a neverending state of trying to "get things done!" It's as if we're on a constantlyturning hamster wheel. Running around and around, only stopping to sleep, and then back on in the morning, once again turning around and around. And yet today, with our hamster wheels in high speed, comes Rosh HaShanah. We are told to stop, and to reflect on the past and on what we hope the future brings. We're instructed to evaluate last year's accomplishments and to address the many areas needing improvement. We're told to forgive those who have wronged us and to show those we love how much they're appreciated.

If you were to evaluate last year on a scale from 1 - 10, with "10" being a tremendous year full of happy occasions, success, health and infinite love, and "1" being a dreadful year of failures, health issues, sadness and loss, how would you rate your year? Most of us would score somewhere in the middle. Maybe it was a good year, like a 7? Or maybe yours was a tough year and you'd rank it as a 3? As I look around though, it's hard for me to tell where each of you fall on your own personal spectrum. Everyone looks so well dressed, poised and content. But I know there are some 1's and 2's out there. Maybe the person sitting right next to you, or in front of you, is going through health issues or grieving the loss of a loved one. It's impossible to see another's problems from the exterior alone

That's why a fundamental teaching of our Torah is to treat each other with loving kindness and compassion. Regardless of how you see a person, or how they look, you never really know what they're going through. I try to be kind to people and give them the benefit of the doubt. For instance, if someone is rude to me, instead of being rude back I assume they're having a rough day and try not to take it personally. I just smile

and say "have a nice day." Because being kind is contagious, even small acts of kindness and compassion, like a friendly comment or a compliment, can have a powerful impact.

In addition to being Rosh HaShanah, today is also National Grandparents Day. Most people aren't aware this holiday even exists, but it does and has since 1973! (Here I'd like to give a shout out to my parents Susie and Michael Kent, and Lynn Modell and Ken Modell.) As Jews we have an obligation to honor our grandparents, and the High Holidays are a perfect opportunity to both spend more time with them, and to tell them how much they're appreciated. Both they, as well as other seniors in the community, should know that we value what a gift they are in our lives.

And speaking of elders, it was our great, great, great grandparents who founded Temple Beth El in 1850. When there were only a handful of Jews living in Detroit, we were the first Jewish congregation in Michigan. And look at us now: A thriving Temple with over 1,100 families! Our Early Childhood Center's enrollment is up over 50% and our Young Family Memberships are increasing.

And so, on this Rosh HaShanah, let's take a break from the "hamster wheel" effect of modern life to appreciate our family and friends. To be kind and compassionate toward others, and to cherish our grandparents and elders.

May you have a year of health, happiness and peace. In other words, I wish you all a perfect "10" of a new year.

TBE board member, Jim Rice, has served on the Lions Hearing Center of Michigan's (LHCM) board of directors for the past five years, which was established by his father-in-law in 2000, the late Dr. Robert H. Mathog: renown otolaryngologist, researcher and educator. The LHCM recently announced that it has merged with the Lions of Michigan Foundation (LMF), a statewide run charity.

LHCM is a non-profit that serves southeastern Michigan by helping the deaf and hard of hearing by providing affordable hearing aids and offering hearing screening services to thousands of children and adults each year to those in need. It also helps their families find resources and support.

The merger will strengthen both organizations, and together, help many more people throughout the state who suffer from hearing loss. The new combined affordable hearing aid programs will be named in honor of Dr. Mathog and will be called The Dr. Robert H. Mathog Lions Hearing Centers.

#### **SAMMI GOLDSMITH**

Sammi Goldsmith is a recent graduate from the University of Michigan, where she studied Sociology with a concentration in Law, Justice, and Social Change. During her time at Michigan, she did creative arts work in the local county jail, assisted in sexual assault prevention research, and helped to revive a racial justice committee within her Hillel. Sammi spent this past summer in Washington DC as a summer staffer with the Anti-Defamation League, and is excited to be staying in DC for the next year as an Eisendrath Legislative Assistant with the Religious Action Center of Reform Judaism where she'll be working on a portfolio that includes civil rights, racial justice, voting rights, criminal justice reform, the death penalty, and gun violence prevention.

Through this combined effort, Jim says "The Lions of Michigan can make a real difference in improving the quality of life for the hearing impaired and to help realize its long-term goal of implementing a standardized hearing healthcare program for all of Michigan. I'm proud of this effort and grateful that the Lions of Michigan through this merger has helped preserve Dr. Mathog's important legacy as a scientific and medical advocate for those directly and indirectly affected by hearing loss."

Sammi will also be supporting the RAC's legislative priorities in the state of Ohio. Sammi is the daughter of Jeff and Sue Goldsmith, and the granddaughter of Lee and Sandy Marks.



**BLESSING YOUR HOME:** A *mezuzah* can make a house feel like a Jewish home, and our clergy are available to help you affix a *mezuzah* with a simple ceremony to bless your home.

**SPIRITUAL COUNSELING:** Life is filled with beauty, but it also contains difficulties. Judaism has a lot to offer, and our compassionate clergy are here to talk with you confidentially about any emotional, spiritual, or religious concerns you would like to discuss.

**ELDER CARE:** No matter how much we love our aging family members, it can be overwhelming to deal with the emotions that come with changes in their needs and abilities – Temple is here to help.

**HOSPITAL VISITS:** Whether you or a loved one are in the hospital for surgery, illness or another reason, we are here to offer comfort, spiritual guidance, and practical support. Our clergy visit hospitals throughout the metro area regularly, and are ready with a prayer, song, or gentle conversation.

**SHIVA CORPS:** After a funeral, it is customary to gather for *Shiva* to share stories, comfort one another, and join together for a brief service. In addition to our clergy, the TBE *Shiva* Corps is a group of volunteers who are ready to provide an opportunity to share memories and say Mourner's *Kaddish* surrounded by community.

**UNVEILING:** Near the end of the first year after the death of a loved one, we return to the cemetery for an "unveiling" ceremony to install and bless a permanent marker at the gravesite.
