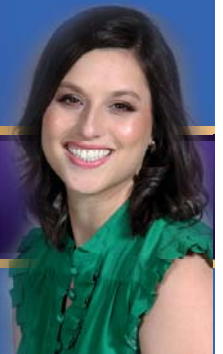

JEWISH SUMMER CAMPS: BUILDING JEWISH IDENTITY - activities, friendships and communal life -

One of our most fundamental goals is to help children grow into active, committed, knowledgeable, and caring Jewish adults. Here at Temple Beth El, we offer a wide range of opportunities ... but we also rely on a secret weapon: Jewish summer camps!

Everything from formal studies to our own stories tell us that camp is one of the best ways to build a strong Jewish identity. And our kids have access to a number of wonderful camps. Just 45 minutes from Temple is the popular and renowned Camp Tamarack. Tamarack started as our own Temple's Fresh Air Society, and continues to run a program based on tremendous access to nature, an incredible array of sports and arts activities, and a solid foundation in Jewish culture.

Our Reform Movement also runs a series of 16 summer camps around the country. In addition to great activities and beautiful facilities, these URJ camps offer an immersive program based on the same Reform Jewish values that guide our congregation. Every day, campers have a chance to swim, climb the Migdal (Tower), compete in various sports, express themselves in all sorts of arts, and deepen their understanding of how Judaism can create joy and meaning in our lives.

Once again last summer, our Director of Education, Debbie Morosohk and Rabbi Miller each spent a week on the faculty of the Goldman Union Camp Institute (GUCI) in Zionsville, Indiana. They led programs, helped with services, spent time hanging out with campers, and served as a Judaic resource for the entire camp community. It was not only a way for them to contribute to our regional Reform community, but to connect with campers and staff and to bring back ideas for our own programs at TBE.

Next summer seems like a long time away, but we are already making plans for visits from camp directors so that more kids can participate in these wonderful Jewish camps next summer. Watch for details soon!

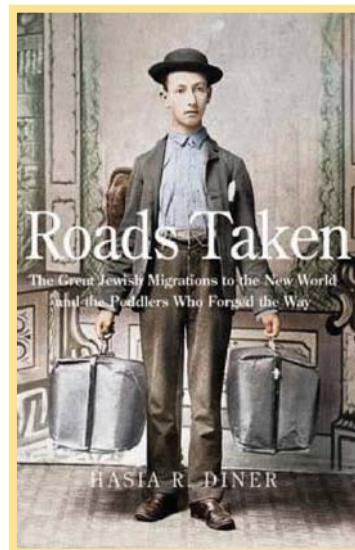

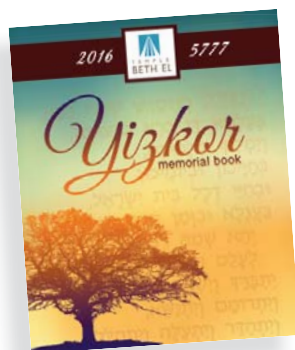

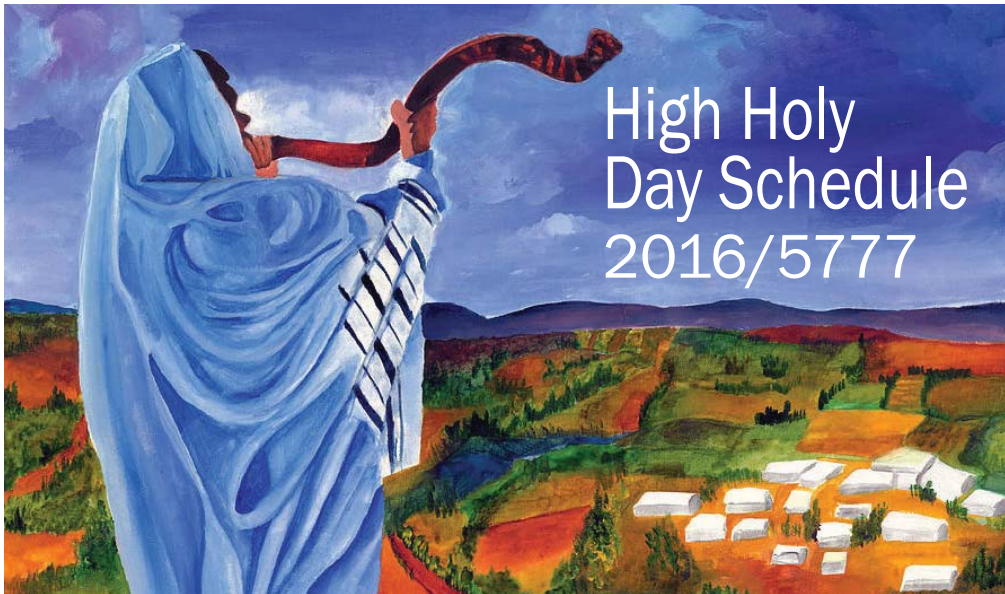

High Holy Day Schedule 2016/5777



MEMBER ADMISSION: Every adult member (in good standing) of Temple Beth El will receive a High Holy Day ticket in the mail. Tickets are good for all services on Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur – please present your ticket upon arrival.

CHILDREN and YOUNG ADULTS: Children and college students up to age 25, or dependents living in a member's household, will not be receiving a High Holy Day ticket. These groups are welcome to enter with their parents. Children under 13 are welcome to enter, as long as they are accompanied by a parent/responsible adult with a High Holy Day ticket ... and we ask that you make sure your children attend the service(s) most appropriate for their age and attention span.

GUESTS: Temple members (in good standing) may request tickets for extended family or friends by sending in the form (included in mail with tickets) with a minimum \$72/ticket donation to the Temple.

YOM KIPPUR MEMORIAL SERVICE: The 4:30 pm Memorial Service on the Day of Atonement is a solemn service of remembrance during which we read the names of those loved ones who have died since last Yom Kippur. Names to be read must be received in the Rabbis' Study no later than Friday, September 23.

BABY SITTING: Babysitting service is available by reservation only. Babysitting on Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur will be available from 9:45 am until the end of the morning service – in the ECC wing (0-6 years), and at Benton's Place (ages 7-12). Children must be dropped off and picked up by a parent or guardian. Please go to www.tbonline.org/hhdchildcare and fill out the "Child Care - High Holy Days" form under the Registration tab.

PRAYER BOOKS: Gates of Repentance, the Reform Movement's Machzor, will be used again this year. Temple Beth El does not furnish books, but they may be purchased at the Temple office before September 30 for \$25. On Yom Kippur afternoon, Temple will once again provide a printed booklet with service materials from the Reform Movement's brand new Machzor, as we prepare to utilize these new books in the future.

COURTESY TRAVEL FORMS: Members planning to be out of town for the High Holy Days may request a Courtesy Form from our office entitling them to admission to any Reform Temple affiliated with the Union for Reform Judaism. Arrangements must be made in advance.
