s I write this, we are in the period between Passover and Shavuot, the 49 days where we "count the omer." It is a particularly good time for introspection, for looking at where each of us is on our journey, and preparing ourselves spiritually for the giving of the Torah, which we commemorate on Shavuot. This year, Erev Shavuot is Saturday, June 4, and we will be celebrating with an event in the tent with Monger's Provisions. However, the previous evening, June 3, will also feel like a culmination of sorts. We will be welcoming Nefesh Mountain to our Shabbat service. Many of you tuned in when the married leaders of the band, Doni Zasloff and Eric Lindberg, joined us virtually for our very first Global Voices Shabbat in November of 2020. They gave us a cohesive, moving, and rocking fusion of bluegrass, old time music, and Jewish tradition, and, just as Larry Epstein told me was his goal for this series, they "widened our understanding of Judaism and Jewish music." Now, nineteen months later, they will be with us in person along with the three other members of their band, which will serve to amplify the impact that we previously experienced. My thanks to Larry and Mary Epstein for continuing to sponsor this important series.

It is also a time of year when our days are getting longer, and, for some of us, our kids are staying outside later, playing in the neighborhood. I am noticing a new independence in my daughter this Spring - popping

down the street to go to a friend's house without needing me to walk her, a desire to stay home alone for periods of time, and more need for privacy. She keeps saying to me, "Mom, I'm almost 11!" Counting down the days to this next age, as it brings more independence and, as she views it, more privileges.

For me, having attended a couple of large events at temple recently (the 2nd night seder and the archives fundraiser, Hidden in Plain Sight), I have been seeing many congregants whom I have not seen in person in two years. Some have not recognized me - which is not surprising, since my hair is a different color and I am wearing a mask, but it has been a pleasure to reconnect. I am aware, in myself and in others, how much we change when our meetings are years apart, instead of days, weeks, or months. Time continues to march on, and if we are lucky, we allow ourselves to grow and change and learn more about ourselves through the journey.



Sparked from a detail found in her book on Detroit, Lila Corwin Berman will reveal how the history of American Jewish philanthropy tells us far more than a simple success story and share the complicated and sometimes troubling history of American state policy, economic inequality, and enfeebled democracy.

LILA CORWIN BERMAN holds the Murray Friedman Chair of American Jewish History at Temple University, where she directs the Feinstein Center for American Jewish History. Her most recent book, The American Jewish Philanthropic Complex: The History of a Multibillion-Dollar Institution, has been awarded the 2021 Ellis W. Hawley Prize from the Organization of American Historians and the Saul Viener Book Prize from the American Jewish Historical Society. Her articles have appeared in several scholarly publications, including the American Historical Review, Journal of American History, and AJS Review, and she has written guest columns for the Washington Post, the Forward, the Chronicle of Higher Education, and the Chronicle of Philanthropy. She is currently working on a new book called "America's Jewish Question" about the inclusions and exclusions of American liberalism. Berman is a graduate of Amherst College and received her Ph.D. from Yale University.

Beth El! The Confirmation ceremony was created by the Reform movement to celebrate our young people who continue their Jewish education well into their teen years. The early Reformers wanted to establish an egalitarian ceremony for teens who would be more mature than bar/bat mitzvah students. We continue that tradition every year at TBE giving our 10th grade students an opportunity to reflect and express their commitment to Jewish learning and living. This year six students joined the legacy of Confirmation classes at Temple Beth El at Shabbat services on Friday, April 22nd.

The teen years are so important in the identity development of our young people, and we highly value the continuing engagement of our teens. We value their continued Jewish education so highly that we invest in it – literally. All high school students who continue their Jewish education from bar/bat mitzvah through to graduation from our program are presented with a check for \$2500 from the Ruth Franklin Einstein Education Assistance Fund of Temple Beth El. Our hope is that this incentive will tempt even more of our teens to stay.

TBE is only one of a few temples or synagogues in the United States that has a full-time braille bindery, run completely by volunteers.

Temple Beth El's **Sisterhood Braille Bindery** is proudly recognized as a leader in the printing and distributing of FREE Braille books for children by the Perkins School for the Blind in Boston, Massachusetts, where Helen Keller went to school in the mid-1850s. TBE's Braille Bindery was organized in 1959, and since then we have over 2,000 books, and an extensive website with online ordering. Our staff of volunteers is led by Janet Mazzara, a braillist certified by the Library of Congress. Our books are printed on our high-speed embossers, then bound, labeled, and shipped anywhere in the U.S. or Canada free of charge. We ship between 500-1,000 books each year to blind or low-vision children. Sisterhood funds the bindery and invites tax-free contributions to defray the cost of machines, braille paper, and other incidental expenses. 
