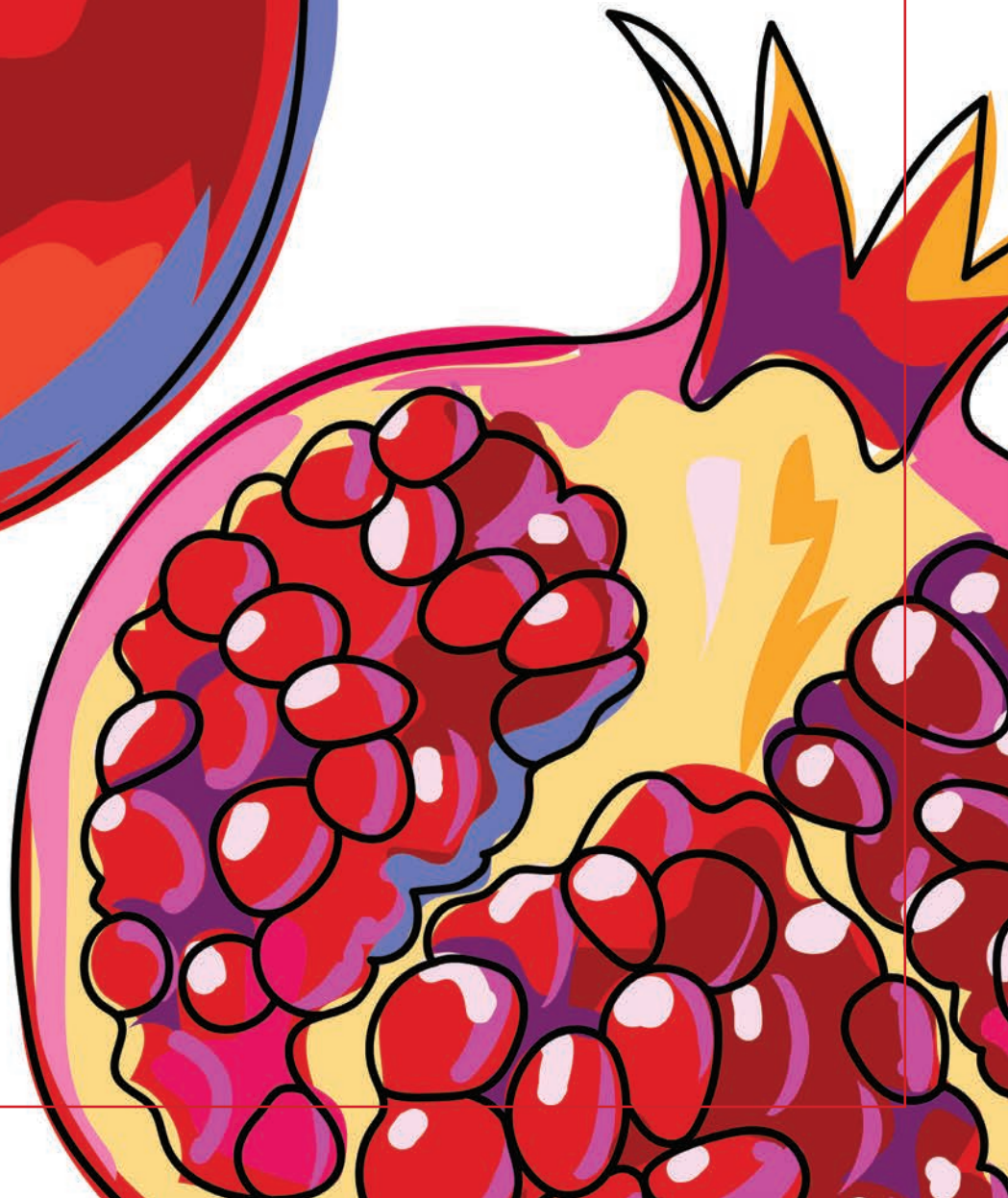

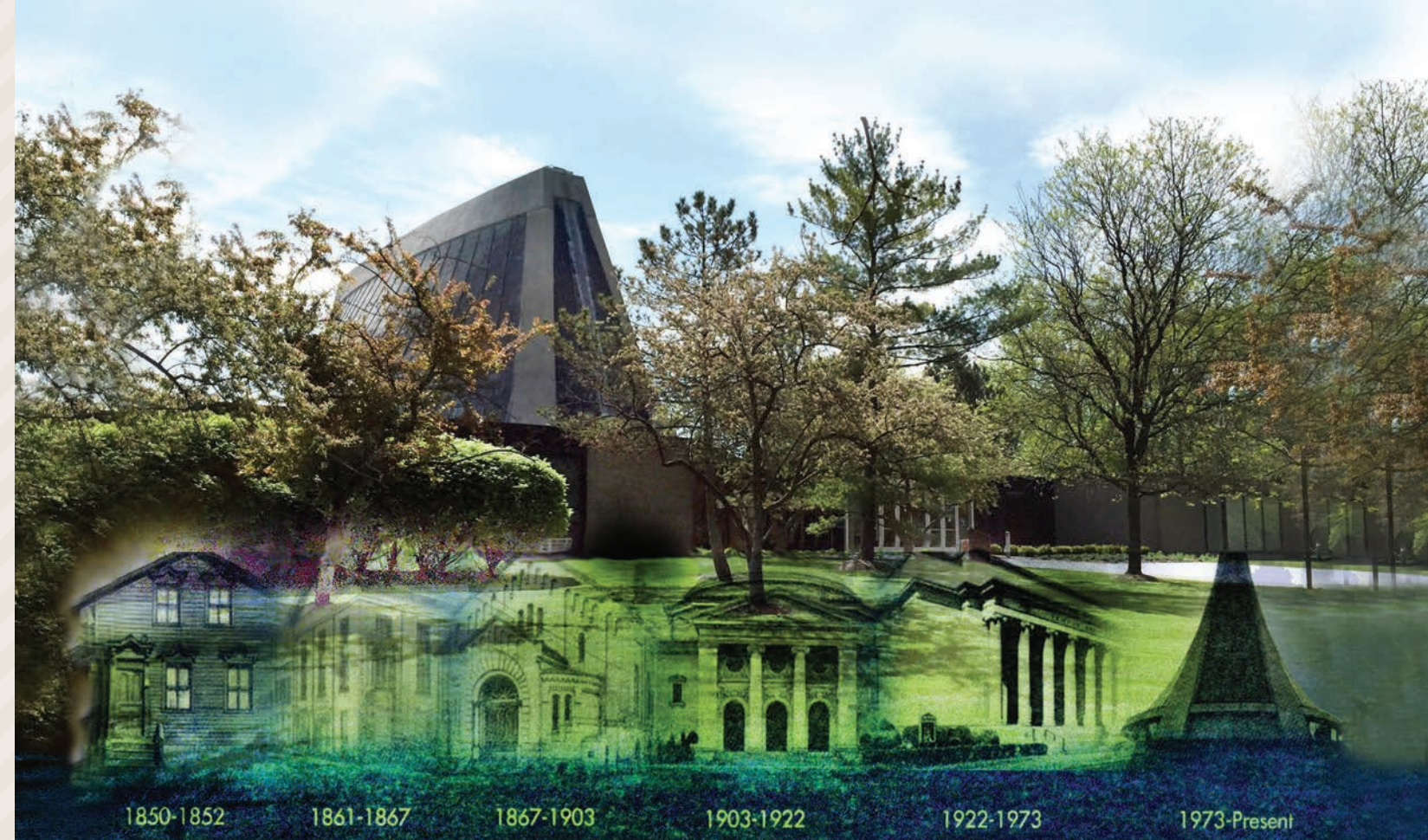
On June 8, I was honored and humbled to be sworn in as the new President of Temple Beth El. Having grown up outside of the Reform movement and synagogue life, I am keenly aware of what this synagogue has given to me and my family. It has been another Jewish home, a place of community, a place of friendship, and a place of learning. I have watched my children stand on the bimah celebrating moments from consecration to b'nai mitzvah. I have met new friends and deepened my relationships with old friends. And along the way, I have continually deepened my connection with Judaism.

Keeping in mind all that Temple has given me, I am thrilled to announce a new initiative to ensure that Temple continues to meet the needs of its congregants for years to come. Temple – through a generous gift from the Hermelin-Davidson Center for Congregational Excellence – is undergoing a visioning and strategic planning process. Through this process, our congregation will have the opportunity to think about how Temple serves its members going forward and then plan for this exciting future.

For the past three years of pandemic, our leadership did an exemplary job of

being nimble and responsive to the ever-changing needs of a community that was deprived of physical connection. But while both the realities and scars of COVID have not left us, we are now able to look towards the future instead of merely needing to grapple with the moment we are in.

This opportunity to think about and plan for the future is an amazing gift as well as a responsibility of leadership. A leader in the reform movement recently told me that it was not enough to thank our own ancestors for what they had done for us, but it is also important to think about the ancestors we want to be. At Temple Beth



El, we are immersed in history. Our congregational ancestors founded the first synagogue in Michigan, founded the Reform movement, and founded the Central Conference of American Rabbis. Our more recent ancestors chose to move our congregation to our wonderful home in Bloomfield Hills. We owe them each a debt for their foresight and planning for our amazing reality today.

But as we thank them, we also need to think about our own future. What will congregational life look like in 20 years? What about metro Detroit? Jewish Detroit? Our geographic spread? Jewish education?

Often when we hear about a Jewish future, we can be overwhelmed by the prognostications of doom. But as a sociologist working in Jewish demography, I am overwhelmingly optimistic about the future of our vibrant American Jewish community. The Jewish future will undoubtedly look different than the Jewish past, but that has always been true. My children's Jewish childhood looks very different from my own, which was different than my parents' childhoods, which was different than my grandparents' childhoods and so forth back through the generations.

It is time for Temple Beth El to start planning for our own vibrant Jewish future. I look forward to both updating you and inviting your help as this process unfurls.

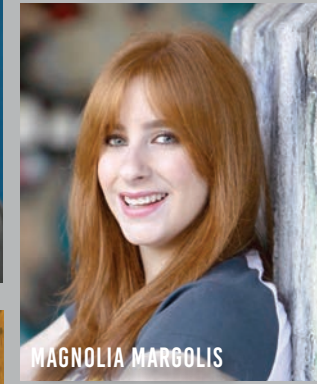

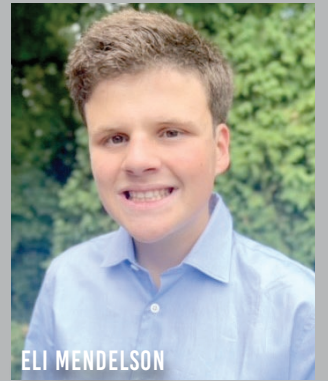

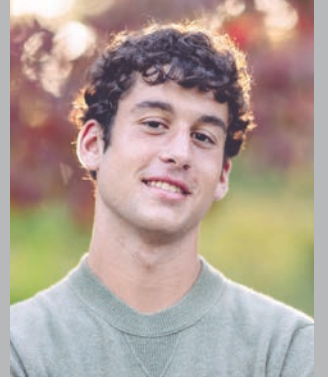

Unleashing Imagination:

TEMPLE BETH EL'S BRAILLE BINDERY EMPOWERS THE BLIND WITH FREE BOOKS



Temple Beth El's Braille Bindery, established in 1959, provides books to blind and low-vision children, a cause that often goes unnoticed within the congregation. Thanks to the commitment of volunteers, these books are transcribed, hand-bound, and shipped at no cost to recipients across the United States.

In the past year alone, the Bindery has produced and delivered over 1,500 books, including beloved titles such as "Harry Potter and the Sorcerer's Stone," "If You Give a Mouse a Cookie," and "Charlie and the Chocolate Factory." Their website, www.freebraillebooks.org, offers a comprehensive collection of over 2,000 titles, enabling parents, children, librarians, and educators to easily place orders.

Volunteers emboss books using computer files containing transcribed texts. Every week, a dedicated group of approximately a dozen volunteers gathers to assemble thousands of embossed pages. These pages are numbered, perforated paper is separated, spiral binding with covers is applied, and each book is labeled in print and braille. After undergoing a final quality check, the books are meticulously packed and shipped nationwide.

The Bindery is fortunate to have two certified brailleists from the Library of Congress volunteering their expertise. In addition to brailleing labels for outgoing books, these skilled transcribers create new books, update the library collection to the

United English Braille format, and ensure an error-free catalog. The Bindery also welcomes special requests.

As a volunteer-driven initiative, the Bindery relies solely on support from Temple Beth El Sisterhood and private donations. Recently, they received a generous grant from the "Call Sam Cares" program. The largest expenses incurred are for special thick-stock Braille paper, computer maintenance, embossers, website fees, and office supplies. Fortunately, the United States Postal Service ships the books free of charge under the provision of Free Matter for the Blind.



A standard page of braille consists of 40 cells across 25 lines, with each cell representing a letter. On average, one printed page translates to 2 1/2 braille pages. Unlike printed books that utilize both sides of a page, the Bindery employs one-sided braille. For example, the print edition of "Harry Potter and the Sorcerer's Stone" spans six volumes, totaling approximately 75 braille pages per volume.

Braille exists in two versions: uncontracted and contracted. Uncontracted braille replicates the print letter by letter, while contracted braille employs over 250 contractions representing common words and letter combinations. Typically, individuals start by learning uncontracted braille in childhood and progress to contracted braille as their proficiency increases. Sadly, only about 10% of the blind population reads braille. Illiteracy among the blind directly affects employment opportunities and contributes to poverty.

Learning braille presents various challenges, including limited access to qualified teachers, the difficulties of sighted individuals teaching blind children, and limited availability of materials. The Bindery's volunteers are grateful for the opportunity to address these challenges and make a small, yet significant impact. Although the majority of braille books are intended for children, the Bindery also serves adults who have lost their vision or are experiencing visual impairment, providing them with a gateway to learning braille later in life.

What is T13G? Pesach

WHERE STRANGERS BECAME FAMILY

Let me tell you the story. Once upon a time, at the Temple Beth El Family Passover Seder, a group of strangers gathered. Each of them had independently decided to attend the event as singles, with varying degrees of uncertainty about how the night would unfold.



Upon arrival, they were given name tags and assigned to the now famous Lucky Table 13. Initially, the long table seemed intimidating, but they randomly found their seats. Sitting by the door initially seemed advantageous, as it offered a quick exit if needed, but luckily, that wasn't necessary.

After the customary self-introductions and memorizing each other's names (Marshall, Daphyene, Jacob, Barbra and Richard) just in case the name tags fell off, the Seder began. Although they started the meal as strangers, the simple act of breaking Matzoh together initiated a bonding process among these fearless Jews. Naturally, the topic of conversation revolved around how each of them ended up attending the Seder alone, not knowing anyone else there.



Here are some of the T13G's personal stories:

JACOB

“Similar to our people wandering through the desert for 40 years in search of their destined place, we strangers wandered to Bloomfield Hills for a Pesach Seder at TBE and found ourselves comfortably celebrating Passover among new friends at Table 13. Going alone to an event can be intimidating for some people, but at Temple Beth El, coming alone does not mean being alone.

You may walk in by yourself, but you walk out with friends. At Temple Beth El, you're among friends and your Jewish family.”

DAPHYENE

“All my life, I felt that something was missing in terms of worshiping and fitting into a culture I could better identify with, but I didn't know how, where, or when to find it. I am an African American woman who was born and raised in a predominantly Jewish community until the age of seven. Temple Abraham was just across the street from our house, and every morning, I would brush my teeth while looking at the Star of David. As years went by, my dad passed away, and the community changed, but my desire to convert to Judaism grew.

In 2019, I moved into an apartment, and to my surprise, I met my neighbor, an African American Jewish woman. Over the next few years, we discussed Jewish culture and the joys of Judaism. In around 2021, I finally followed my heart's desire and started attending 'Introduction to Judaism' classes at Temple Beth El. I went to Shabbat services and experienced the celebrations of holy days and festivals with my neighbor.

In 2023, I was thrilled to learn about the TBE family Passover Seder. I was optimistic about having a delightful time, learning more about the celebration of Passover, and possibly meeting new people. I found myself assigned to Table Thirteen with several other single strangers. As someone who has never been married and has no children, the table at the TBE 'Family Seder' was perfect for me. My expectations were more than met. During the Seder, we prayed, ate, and shared stories. Before leaving, we made plans to stay in touch. We had our first Table Thirteen Group meeting in April, where we shared more about our life experiences, discussed our single status, and talked about expanding our group.”

MARSHALL

“Attending the Temple Beth El Family Passover Seder turned out to be an unexpected blessing for me this Pesach. I grew up in NY and celebrated most holidays with

my family. After I moved to Michigan many years ago, we would make the trip back to NY as often as possible to be with my family. That was the original plan for this year. Unfortunately, my now ex-partner decided to permanently leave Michigan to be closer to her family. With little time left before the holiday, I anticipated spending Pesach alone. However, a friend of mine found out about my situation and invited me to join her family for either night. I chose the first Seder night, and while I was welcomed there, I still felt like a visitor. That left the second night.

Wanting more for Passover, I considered the option of having a 'Seder for one' again. Fortunately, I came across the announcement for the Temple Beth El Family Passover Seder and thought it might be a good idea. I was hesitant at first because I was newly single and without family, and I thought it might be uncomfortable sitting with families or people who came together. But I cast my reservations aside and made a reservation. I was pleased to see that the reservation form asked for seating preferences. I mentioned that I was coming alone and would prefer to be seated with other singles or at least couples without kids, if possible. I found a seat at Table Thirteen, and to my delight, we bonded as a group of Jews from different backgrounds who had the privilege of celebrating Pesach together. Within a couple of hours, we became like a newly created family, enjoying each other's company.

TBE made this wonderful experience possible. We met again in April to discuss potential future activities or events. Hopefully, our stories and this article will inspire those of you who may be hesitant to meet new people, make new friendships, or explore new interests to get out there and start participating.”

Conclusion ...

By the end of the Seder, after sharing experiences, laughter, and perhaps a few cups of wine or grape juice, they had become friends. It was then that they officially formed the Table Thirteen Group (T13G). A week later, they gathered again to chat and make plans for the future.

Yes, as the saying goes, fairy tales can come true. It can happen to you too. The T13G invites any intrepid, like-minded singles who would like to meet interesting and fun new people to join them, attend their gatherings or activities at or outside of TBE. On Monday, May 8th we welcomed over 200 people to the Community Grand Opening of the Joan Meyers Jampel Center for Michigan Jewish Heritage!

Participants had the chance to explore the Jampel Center in a multitude of ways and learn about the resources it has to offer. The evening began with a nosh and schmooze with fellow history enthusiasts. Attendees also had the opportunity to view several exhibits including the Stuck on You: Israel's 75 Year History Through Stamps exhibit, which can still be found in the Fetter Exhibit Gallery through the end of the summer!

Five different sessions gave a taste of what users can expect from the Jampel Center. Archivist Brian Schamber took people step by step through the process of digitization and showed off the new community digitization station - opening soon! The Jampel Center's intern, Emily Kaufman, demonstrated how

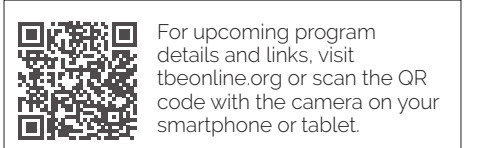
Membership in the Beth Elders is open to all Temple Beth El members and their spouses/partners. Annual dues are \$18 for the year per person.
