PRESIDENT'S UPDATE:

During these first few months serving as president, it has been a true delight to connect with so many congregants of Temple Beth El. Each interaction has reinforced how dedicated, caring, and thoughtful our congregants are. Each conversation strengthened my energy and enthusiasm for this amazing community.

Over the summer, the Board of Trustees connected with congregants through three listening sessions where ideas and feedback were shared. The Board was truly honored to hear from the dozens of people who showed up and this feedback will improve the work of the board going forward this year.

One way that the trustees will be able to connect to the congregation is through our participation in the Union for Reform Judaism's congregational assessment and benchmarking project. Temple Beth El is participating in this project in three distinct ways.

First, the congregation itself participated in an annual pulse survey where Temple Beth El provided data to the reform movement to help benchmark congregations across the country.

Second, over the summer the Board of Trustees participated in qualitative board self-assessment, so we could look at the strength of our congregation's leadership, mission, and governance. This was followed by a URJ Board Member leading a full-day retreat for the Trustees to improve our internal governance.

The final – and most important – component is a congregation-wide survey which will occur between October 9-29 where every congregant will have the opportunity to give feedback about the priorities and needs of our community. The results from this survey are vital to the planning for our future.

I am also thrilled that the work of strategic planning and visioning has been moving forward. This has been an incredibly rewarding process and I am

grateful to everyone who has dedicated their time and thoughtfulness to the process. The trustees and staff have engaged in robust conversations about the future vision for Temple Beth El. I look forward to sharing more about the strategic plan and vision later this year.

In addition, the Board is looking for other ways to improve communication between congregants and trustees, so we can ensure that we are doing the best job possible in serving the congregation. Be on the lookout for new initiatives! However, communication should never be limited to these formal programs. Please feel free to reach out to me or other trustees with your thoughts and feedback. We look forward to the opportunity to connect with each of you.

Building a Stronger Community Through CARING



CURRENT LEADERSHIP AND INVOLVEMENT:

For the past three years, Sharon Green and Judy Marx have been co-leaders of the Caring Community. This co-leadership role was originally held by Judy's daughter, Jennifer Hollander, and Sharon. Jennifer, recognizing the alignment between the project's values and our temple's mission, believed that Judy would be an ideal fit to join forces with Sharon when Jennifer's work commitments began to demand more of her time.

Rabbi Brudney, our clergy liaison, plays an instrumental role in connecting the Caring Community with TBE members in need. She regularly passes on information about individuals who could benefit from a friendly phone call, a note, or a kind gesture, often due to health issues or other difficulties. Our committee members, all dedicated volunteers, step up to contact these members—sometimes just once, sometimes many times. Many volunteers sign up to connect with several people each month!

WHAT WE DO:

There are three primary Caring Community activities:

1. Baby Baskets

We celebrate new additions to our temple families by delivering Beth El Baby Baskets to parents. These thoughtful gestures welcome the newest members of our community and symbolize the support and warmth that define our Temple.

2. Phone Calls

Each month our volunteers make phone calls to members who might enjoy a warm and supportive conversation in a challenging moment.

3. Notes

Our volunteers also send notes to congregants in need to let them know that Temple is thinking about them and here for them.

The Heart of Our Mission:

The Caring Community has a rich history that dates back several years. It all began when Rabbi Miller and his family came to TBE—and Rachel Ann, along with Sharon Green and Carol Schwartz, emerged as its pioneers. While Carol now resides out of state, Rachel Ann and Sharon have preserved the legacy of its beginnings.

Our reach extends to well over 20 members each month, illustrating the substantial impact we have within our community. We cherish the opportunity to uplift and support our fellow members during challenging times.

REACHING OUT TO OUR ELDERLY: AN OUTGROWTH OF THE CARING COMMUNITY

This initiative, founded and spearheaded by Judy Roberts and Nancy Fortier, connects Temple members with other members 90 and over. We ask volunteers to make three phone calls per year to their assigned partner in hopes of building an ongoing relationship and keeping them connected to our TBE community.

ELUL *reflections*

I hope you all had a meaningful high holiday experience whether you spent it in person with us, tuned in to Temple virtually, or somewhere else entirely. I am feeling so thankful for our community and wanted to make sure I shared some of our successes with you!

This year, our theme for Elul (the Jewish month of planning and preparation leading up to the high holidays) was fashion and sustainability. For a few years now, I have really enjoyed adding a specific lens to our Elul observance beyond the perennial focus on introspection and cheshbon hanefesh (an accounting of the soul).

We kicked off this Elul reading Fashionopolis: Why What We Wear Matters by Dana Thomas as our inaugural Bites and Books offering for 2023-2024. This book provided a deep look into the industry of fashion and the shocking environmental damage and human rights abuses it has wrought—and also spotlighted some of the creative designers and companies working to reform it. If you are interested in learning more about this topic, you can still check out the book from our Prentis Memorial Library!

I was inspired by the book to introduce Temple to Olivia Newman, a local Jewish clothing designer. Olivia owns an online store called Polly Lava that sells uniquely upcycled, reworked, and thrifted vintage clothes carefully curated from the 60's through the early 2000's. I met her in her home studio in Detroit and interviewed her on Facebook Live as we heard her story, saw some of her merchandise, and discussed the importance of resale and supporting small businesses.

Next, at S'lichot (the brief Saturday evening service heralding the immediacy of the high holidays), we had local influencer and self-declared "enthusiastic style gal" Rachael Renae come teach an interactive workshop on how fashion can be part of being one's best and most authentic self. It was a gorgeous evening under the tent that fostered some fascinating reflection on how we choose to present ourselves to the world—and how that might change or stay the same in 5784.

Our most popular "Elul" event, however, was our high holiday clothing drive to benefit the NCJW Council resale store in Berkley. It was such a thrill to see so many of you dropping off your bags of clothing in the pod in our parking lot—and I want to offer my appreciation to my assistant, Jennifer Ritchie, for helping to staff it! The Sunday after Yom Kippur we had a great gathering of over twenty volunteers to help organize any unsorted clothing before NCJW sent over a truck to bring it all to its new home in their shop. Inspired by our Elul learnings,

I hope some of you will reduce your own clothing-related impact and check out their store (see below) where you can be buying TBE-donated items for several seasons to come!

I hope that 5784 will bring you all great things in fashion and beyond. I will look forward to seeing you all in January upon my return from maternity leave, God willing!

CHAPLAIN, RABBI, ENVOY: A Peek at the Incredible Life of Rabbi Richard C. Hertz

Rabbi Hertz led an extraordinary life before and during his tenure at Beth El, which began when he took the role of senior rabbi in the early 1950s. While many of you knew him, few know about his time as a WWII chaplain, Jewish Community Council leader, Civil Rights advocate, or his many other accomplishments.

Pictures of Rabbi Hertz leading WWII soldiers in a Passover seder. Diaries from his travels to the newly formed State of Israel. White House correspondence about a mission behind the Iron Curtain. These are just a few of the gems we have uncovered in the Rabbi Richard C. Hertz Archival Collection, soon to be open for research, and the exciting topic of this year's Jewish History Detectives!

The Rabbi Leo M. Franklin Archives volunteer, Jane Billecke, is putting the finishing touches on the new Rabbi Hertz Collection. After years of processing (organizing, naming, researching, boxing, foldering, etc), the collection is ready for research! This collection, started under archivist Jan Durecki, will contain roughly 40 boxes of organized material that tells the life and legacy of Richard Hertz. His life is now an open book, or rather, an open box!

Michelle is an award-winning Brooklyn based singer/songwriter and producer best known as a pioneer of celebrating Jewish culture on YouTube with viral videos including "20 Things to do with Matzah", "Rosh Hashanah Girl", and "Hanukkah Lovin." In total, these videos have received millions of hits from around the world and have led to the press referring to Michelle as "A YouTube Sensation."

Inspired by Rav Kook's wisdom of "What is old make new, what is new make holy," Michelle sets out to find connection points to our tradition's wisdom and culture in an easily accessible way. Michelle delivers insightful lyrics with her soulful voice and brings an angelic quality to worship services

while offering a unique opportunity to engage with liturgical texts in a thoughtful and holistic manner.

Whether playing in front of a sold-out crowd of thousands on the beach of Tel Aviv at a Birthright Mega Event, or an intimate set at a coffeehouse in Melbourne, Australia, Michelle's engaging live performances and talent for writing catchy and meaningful songs have garnered rave reviews and numerous accolades including: being named one of The Jewish Week's "36 Under 36 Next Wave of Jewish Innovators," Billboard Music's "Top Songwriters," VH-1 Song of the Year finalist, and recipient of a Great American Songwriting Honor.

Michelle calls her Artist in Residence weekends "Eat. Pray. Sing" - a spiritually uplifting and soul nourishing Shabbat experience that weaves together the three tribal components that have united us for thousands of years - food, prayer and song. We are in for a special treat with a full weekend of events. **Friday, November 17th, Michelle will join the clergy for a meaningful Shabbat service,**

sponsored by Carol and Steve Tarnowsky and Karen and Bruce Kaczander. **Saturday morning, she'll lead a rousing Kid-ish Club Tot Shabbat** for families with little ones age 0-5, sponsored by the Ross Family. **Saturday evening, Michelle will share a spiritual Havdalah and performance** in an intimate setting, with proceeds to benefit the music fund, for future music programming. That evening is sponsored in the memory of

Alex Burnstein, who died tragically this past April, at the age of 20. In addition, **Sunday at 11:00 am, Michelle will be joined by her band for our first annual Alex Burnstein Memorial Concert.** This concert series has been established by Alex's father, Mark, to connect Alex's memory to music, something about which he was passionate and in which he showed such promise.

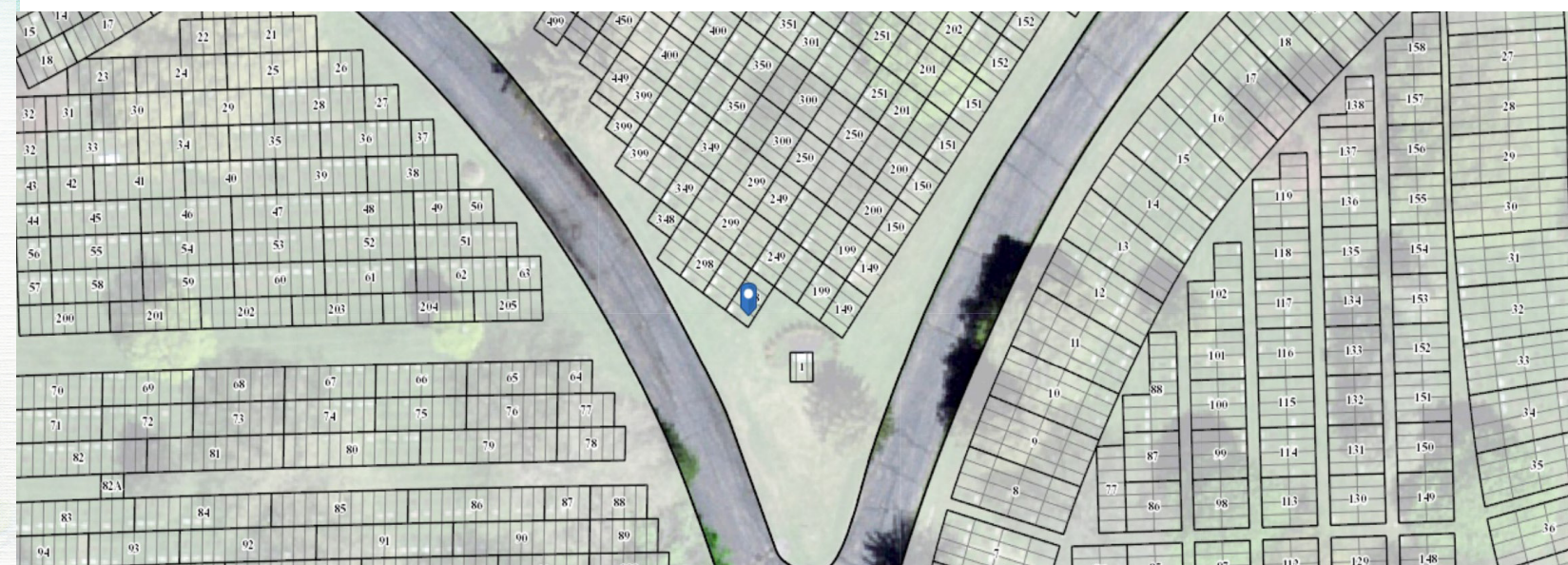

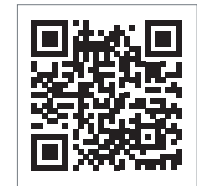

Part of the issue is choosing how to write Hebrew terms with English letters – such as the age-old debate: Chanukah or Hanukkah?! Of course, a friend likes to remind me: the correct way to spell the holiday is chet-nun-vav-kaf-hay. Oy!

Some issues, however, are just about the English itself. At TBE and many other places, we have for many years proudly presented the “High Holidays” – the deeply spiritual season of Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur that we just completed. Celebrating the Start of a New Masa Year

Meet the Passionate Educators Shaping Our Jewish Future

Our Masa year is just getting started and our teachers are ready to go! We spent a Sunday at the end of August together for orientation and the energy was amazing. The Masa staff played ice breaker games designed to help us bond, and we studied Jewish texts together that helped us set our goals and intentions for the year.



Our Director of Security, Ken Jackson, spent time with us reviewing important procedures that we all need to know, and never want to have to use. We discussed best practices for working with our teen madrichim (assistant teachers). We planned, shared, laughed, and left looking forward to a wonderful year ahead.

Our Masa staff is remarkably diverse. We have 4 new teachers and 17 returning teachers this year. Some of our returning teachers have been here 20 years or more! We have teachers in their 20's, teachers in their 60's, and everything in between. Some teach full time during the week while others have a wide variety of other careers.

Our Masa staff also has a lot in common with each other. They are all professionals. They are expected to participate in professional development over the course of the school year, they are paid for their time, and they take the time to plan appropriate engaging lessons and activities that fulfill our Masa mission, inspiring personal journeys and strengthening our sacred community. Our Masa staff members love kids. Yes, they are paid, but teaching in Masa is not an avenue to riches, it is a calling to those who care about children and our Jewish future.

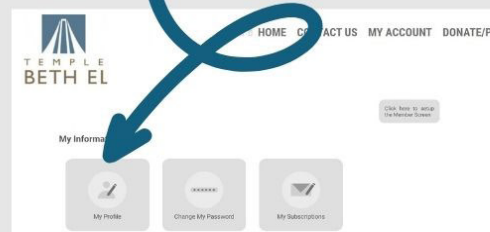

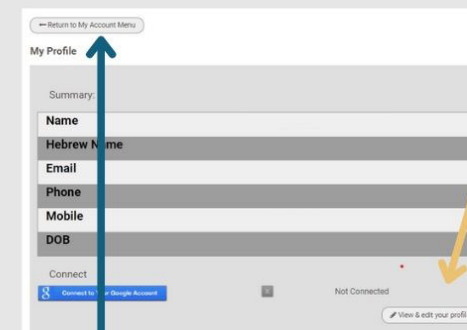

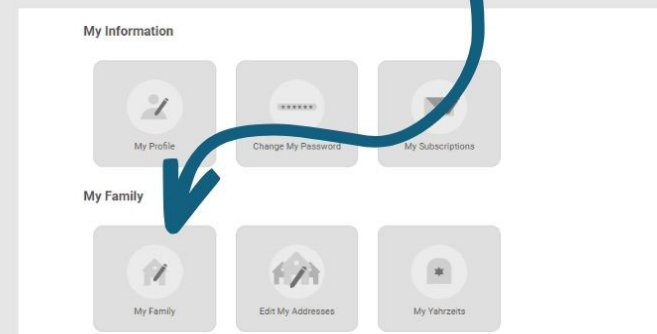
