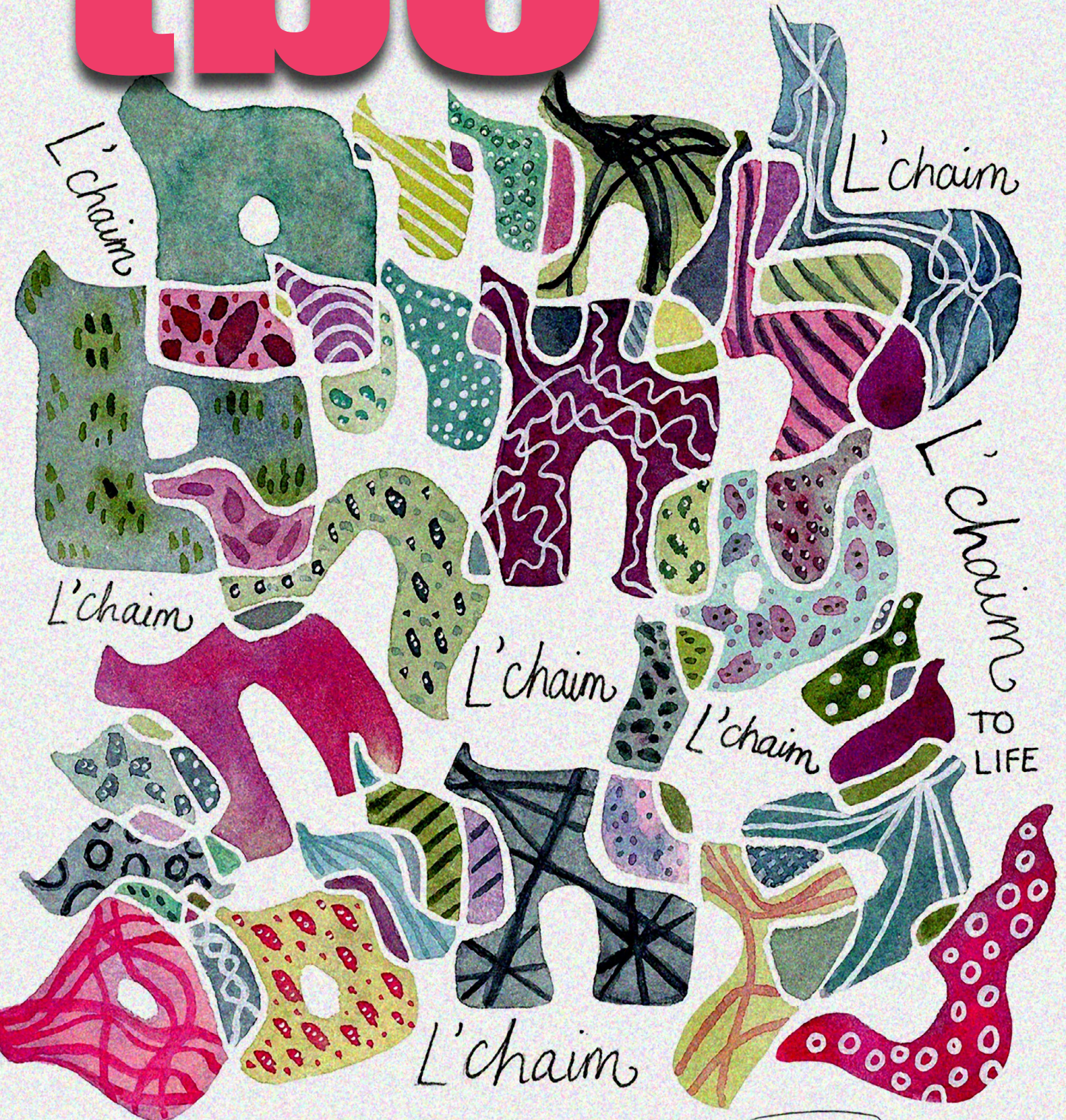

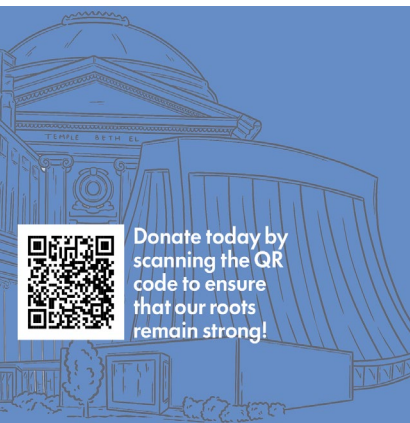
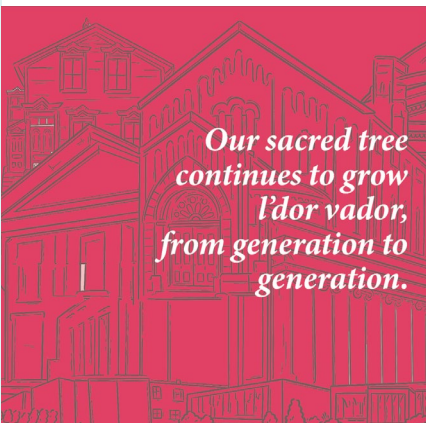

Reflecting on Nearly Thirteen Years at Temple Beth El

When Rachel Ann and I moved our young boys to Michigan at the start of 2014, I was eager to get to know a place that was familiar to me through my dear cousins, Sissi and Max (z"l) Lapides. I grew up hearing stories about Detroit's charm, the power of the Motor City, and the magic of Motown. I knew about Charlevoix and square pizza and Hank Greenberg, as well as the legendary, philanthropic nature of this Jewish community.

It's also true that Detroit had been through tough times—the bankruptcy was fresh, and the Jewish community was ready to embrace a brighter future. TBE specifically was at a precarious moment in our long history, and there was a strong appetite for innovation and growth.

In late 2013, even before I officially started at Temple, I remember sitting in the Bridal Room with a Bar Mitzvah student to work on his speech a few months before the celebration. I remember gathering in David and Elyse Foltyn's living room with several of the Temple's past presidents and current officers to chart our future. I remember the first meeting I had in my temporary office in the ECC wing, with Sisterhood co-presidents Cindy Bolokofsky and Dolly Lax. And I remember purchasing a snow shovel to clear my new driveway (we didn't need those in Houston!)

On my very first "official" day at Temple, I did something that ended up striking a nerve. I asked our maintenance team to remove the separate pulpits in the Sanctuary and replace them with a single one in the center of the bima. This congregation is rightly proud and protective of its magnificent sacred space, and the idea of redefining it made some people a little jumpy. But successful synagogues adapt to new realities over time, and the truth is, unity of purpose on the bima was long overdue. It took some time, but I think people have not only become accustomed to the gorgeous new pulpit (lovingly commissioned by Warren Rose and Steve Weiner), but they have also come to see it as a striking symbol of contemporary Jewish life in our historic Sanctuary.

Looking back, there is so much I am proud of about the last twelve and a half years. It's a bit of a blur and sometimes hard to remember what things were like beforehand ... but



TBE has come to be defined by a thriving ECC, a unique cultural program through our archives and library, excellence in education, cutting-edge worship and music, vital interfaith partnerships, a powerful commitment to Israel, and a stellar Temple staff team that works hard on behalf of this congregation every day.

Although I am excited to start my next professional chapter at Temple Israel of Hollywood this summer (and hope many of you will stay in touch and even visit when you're in LA!), I am also more than a bit anguished to leave behind so many wonderful relationships here at TBE and in our wider community.

I realize that transitions can be difficult, and I don't want to minimize some of the turmoil people have shared with me over the past few months. I am doing my best to remain present for you and to do everything I can to ensure our staff is prepared for the future. In the meantime, I am truly looking forward to the special weekend of June 5-6 and hope to find a chance to talk with many of you before my last day on June 20.

The Psalmist describes a person (or community) seeking increased connection, shelter, and joy. It reminds us that those who cling to God and community will go *m'chayil el chayil* ... from strength to strength (Psalm 84:8). My prayer—and deepest hope—is that you and your family will experience only goodness and kindness in the years ahead, and that this community will be filled with courage, resilience, and holiness.

A Temple Beth El Young Women’s Retreat

Being a parent to young children is, of course, an honor and a privilege. It is also very hard. To name a few challenges, all equal levels of difficulty: hand, foot, and mouth disease; potty regressions; having the audacity to peel a banana for your toddler the “wrong” way (which, for the record, is indistinguishable to most human eyes from the “right way”); figuring out how to answer life’s trickier questions, such as “What is death?” and “How are babies made?” in a developmentally appropriate way that will not be fodder for the intensive therapy said child will inevitably require as an adult.

And how best to navigate these simultaneously wonderful but also challenging stages of life? Community. Especially a community of those in similar life stages with children who also demand perfection in the nuanced art of fruit preparation.

Anyway, all of this is to say: the opportunity for mothers of young children to get together, child-free, for even a short period of time, is a wonderful thing. And the Laugh Learn Lounge Retreat in February, organized by Rabbi Megan Brudney and chairs Hannah Kessler and Alissa VanderKooi, who are also mothers of young children, was a wonderful experience. We laughed. We learned. We laughed some more, truly testing the limits of our pelvic floor physical therapy. We discussed topics light and heavy, big and small. We ate food that we did not cook for ourselves, including a genuinely inspiring cheese board from Monger Provisions (ask me about my newfound obsession with Marcona almonds!) and perfectly constructed meals prepared by Platinum Dish Catering (this is not an exaggeration—the lunch salad bar was perfect). We did yoga led by Melissa Wagasy of Citizen Yoga. We discussed parenting Jewish kids with Elyssa Schmier of the ADL. Gail Rosenbloom Kaplan helped us make our own Shabbat candlesticks, an art project that not only is now displayed proudly in my dining room but also provided a good opportunity for me to practice some mindfulness skills when faced with an impressive, colorful, and briefly overwhelming array of beads. We made new friends and solidified existing friendships.

I could go on, but I’m afraid I’ll write more about my fruit-based trauma, and if you’ve made it this far, your patience for that topic is probably wearing thin. Unless you are one of my fellow mothers of young children, in which case let’s talk, laugh, and eat about it some more when we get together and do this again next year! Snapshot in History

The Joan Meyers Jampel Center for Michigan Jewish Heritage put on a one-day interactive and truly immersive photo history experience for all ages on Sunday, April 26th, 2026.

A five-part exhibit filled with community photographs from 175 years of Jewish Detroit stretched down the museum hallway. Over 100 photographs were displayed throughout the exhibit. Each one captured a part of our history that words cannot encapsulate. The exhibit shed light on the unique lives and experiences of Jewish Michigan, from the everyday to the extraordinary. Some attendees recognized loved ones, while others were introduced to a new part of the Jewish Detroit story they never knew.

Following the exhibit, participants had the chance to step behind the camera and into history for themselves! They popped in the vintage photo booth, snapped a picture with a Polaroid camera, had their faces instantly printed on a cookie, got a professional, old-fashioned family portrait, and some even posed for authentic tintypes! Each station showcased a different era and technique of photography, so attendees could picture themselves in history — literally.

And picture this! The event also included 10 community partners from throughout Jewish Detroit, each with photo collections in the Jampel Center archives. They shared historical photographs from their own archival collections and offered interactive activities that brought the stories behind the images to life.

Don't worry - there is still a chance to see much of the photo exhibit display. Many of the pictures, along with antique cameras and historical photographs, will be on display in the Frances and Joseph Fetter Gallery (by the DeRoy Sanctuary Foyer and Boardroom).

A COMMITMENT TO OUR FUTURE: The MacWilliams Family Fund & The Tent

Temple Beth El's newest initiative, **The Tent**, is already creating excitement in our community, thanks in part to the generosity and vision of **Jo-Ann MacWilliams-Wolf**, who established the MacWilliams Family Fund to support its success. Created to provide meaningful educational opportunities, the fund reflects Jo-Ann's belief in investing in the next generation.

"I've always wanted to support something that helps fill the gaps we're seeing today," Jo-Ann shared. "Programs in the arts, music, literature, and nature are often the first to be reduced. Supporting The Tent helps bring those experiences back for our children."

Rooted in her own Jewish upbringing at Temple Beth El, Jo-Ann believes programs like The Tent help children build identity, connection, and pride in Jewish tradition. "More than ever, our children need to understand who they are and where they come from," she said.

The name The Tent holds special meaning for Jo-Ann, representing "a gathering place filled with nature, tradition, and connection." Inspired by the communal spirit of the Tabernacle in Exodus, she sees it as a modern space where children can form friendships and lasting memories. Jo-Ann also believes the program addresses real community needs by supporting working families.

"This community has given me friendships, mentorship, and opportunities that shaped my life," she reflected. "Supporting this program is a way of giving back and helping ensure those same opportunities exist for future generations."

Thank you to Lucy and Ray Henney on helping support this initiative. For those interested in learning more about The Tent, Jo-Ann shared a heartfelt invitation: "This is something special. It's an opportunity to have a direct, positive impact on our children, our families, and our community. I invite others to join in supporting this program so together, we can create something meaningful and lasting for the next generation."

A whole new model of Jewish education is coming to TBE this fall!

Until now, families seeking Jewish educational programming for their children have generally had two options—day school or synagogue supplementary school. **This fall, a third option will become available at Temple Beth El for families seeking quality after-school care.** This Jewish option offers children the chance to be part of a warm, caring Jewish community every day after school.

Over the past year, Temple Beth El has been working with JASA to lay the foundation for the first Jewish after-school program in Michigan. TBE is proud to announce the launch of **The Tent, a new after-school program opening in fall 2026.**

The Jewish After School Accelerator (JASA) is an organization based in Atlanta that provides synagogues with the tools, guidance, curriculum, and financial support needed to create their own Jewish after-school programs.

Jennifer Dok, Director of The Tent, is looking forward to meeting families and sharing her vision for the program.

"I'm so excited to bring this program to life because it reflects the kind of Jewish education I believe in. One that feels joyful, creative, and deeply connected to who our kids are. We're building something that invites children to explore, ask questions, and feel a real sense of belonging, and I'm honored to help shape that here in the Metro Detroit Jewish community."

Students in grades K-5 can attend The Tent up to five days a week for informal Jewish learning, fun, and friendship in a warm Jewish community. The program will provide homework help, healthy snacks, and camp-style Jewish education, as well as transportation from their school to the program. It will also offer early pickup on half days, and host School's Out Camp Days on many days when schools are closed, for an additional fee.

Sarah Crane, a parent of two children in the Temple Beth El ECC and a member of The Tent's steering committee, said, "While my kids will go to public school, it's important to me that they have a strong connection to Judaism. I love the idea of a fun and educational Jewish after school experience that they'll look forward to each day."

There's A Place For You at TEMPLE BETH EL

In a world where kids and teens are busier than ever, balancing academics, activities, and full schedules can feel like there isn't room for one more commitment. And yet, I keep coming back to the same question: as we help build their futures, how are we helping them stay connected to something deeper? For me, that answer is personal.

Temple Beth El has been part of my story from the very beginning (it's where my parents were married), but over time, it became more than a place for milestones. It became a place where I felt known, supported, and at home. The friendships I found and the experiences I lived through here are what turned it into a true community, and that sense of belonging is what continues to bring me, and now my own family, back.

I was recently thinking about this while watching *Join or Die*, a documentary that follows Robert Putnam's research on community and civic life. One of its simplest and most powerful takeaways is this: it's not necessarily what you join, it's that you join.

This also reminds us that meaningful connection often begins in small groups—spaces where relationships form and a sense of belonging quietly takes root. That's exactly what we are building here.

At TBE, we are not just offering programs; we are creating spaces where kids and teens feel they belong—a place where Jewish identity is not just taught but lived through friendships, shared experiences, and simply being together. We know how full their lives already are, and we celebrate their dedication to school, sports, and everything they are pursuing. But alongside that, we want to ensure their future also feels Jewish, rooted in identity, connection, and community. And the truth is, if we don't create space for this now, it often becomes harder to build later.

And often, the most meaningful moments aren't the big events but the in-between ones—time spent before class, catching up on weekends, celebrating small wins, and simply being together. That's where real connection happens. We saw that connection come to life at this year's


