TEMPLE BETH EL OPENS ITS DOORS

Rooted in a shared commitment to community, compassion, and Jewish continuity, Temple Beth El's response reflects the very heart of our mission: to build and nurture holy relationships. When one community experiences hardship, the broader community is called to respond—not only with words of support, but with tangible acts of care.

In the days following the attack, Temple Beth El leadership quickly mobilized to ensure that Temple Israel could continue its essential religious and communal life. We hosted many b'nai mitzvah services and celebrations, as well as over fifty children and fifteen teachers in our ECC summer camp allowing Temple Israel members to gather safely and maintain a sense of normalcy and connection.

For many Temple Israel members, the gesture provided not only logistical support, but emotional reassurance. Being welcomed into a sacred space offered comfort and continuity during a difficult time. Our congregations are not separate in moments like these as we are deeply interconnected. Opening our doors was a natural expression of who we are and what we believe—that no one should face hardship alone.

Temple Beth El staff played an important role, extending a warm welcome and helping to ensure a smooth transition for guests. From greeting families at the door to assisting with events and services, the spirit of "audacious hospitality" was fully embodied in every interaction.

This moment of unity has reinforced a powerful truth: that Jewish community extends far beyond the walls of any one building. In standing together, Temple Beth El and Temple Israel have demonstrated resilience and an enduring commitment to one another.

As both congregations look ahead, the partnership forged in this challenging moment will continue to shape our relationship—deepening connections and strengthening the broader metro-Detroit Jewish community.

In times of darkness, it is acts of light like these that remind us who we are—and what we can be when we stand together.

SHABBAT MORNING WORSHIP

Two years ago, we introduced a monthly in-person Yachad Shabbat morning service featuring a lay-led Torah reading and clergy-led Torah discussion. Beginning this fall, we are expanding to two in-person Shabbat morning services each month.

As part of this exciting growth, we are retiring the name Yachad and simply referring to these gatherings as Shabbat Morning Services.

Two Types of Shabbat Morning Services

Depending on the calendar:

- **B'nai Mitzvah Services** (typically in the Sanctuary), followed by Kiddush. As a reminder, everyone is welcome to attend our b'nai mitzvah services.
- **Clergy-led Shabbat Morning Services** (typically in the Chapel), featuring lay-led Torah reading, a brief text study, and a Kiddush bagel brunch.

Camp Kehillah

Growing Our Village

At Temple Beth El, we believe it takes a village to raise a child. But a strong village does not happen by accident.

It grows when families feel supported, children feel seen, and everyone knows they belong. For our village to thrive, Temple Beth El should feel like more than a place families visit, but should feel like home.



In our Spring issue, we introduced **THE TENT**, our Jewish after-school program, which combines families' need for dependable after-school care with our commitment to providing meaningful Jewish education.

We understand the realities of today's busy families. Between work, sports, activities, and other obligations, attending traditional religious school is not always feasible for every child. Although we would love every child to participate in our religious school, we believe the essential goal is for every child to receive a Jewish education, regardless of the path through which it is delivered.

Available to children in grades PK-5, The Tent meets families where they are by bringing Jewish learning into the after-school hours. Children receive dependable care while exploring Jewish stories, traditions, values, and holidays through hands-on, camp-inspired experiences. Along the way, they form friendships, strengthen their Jewish identities, and discover that Jewish life can be joyful, relevant, and part of their everyday lives.

CAMP KEHILLAH
grows from that same
vision as the **TENT**.

Kehillah means community, and Camp Kehillah was created to support the whole family. It gives children additional opportunities to experience Jewish life in meaningful ways while inviting parents to participate in Temple programming, build relationships, or take time for themselves.

Camp Kehillah is currently offered on Thursday evenings from 6–9 p.m. Children have dinner, take part in hands-on Jewish learning and creative activities, and enjoy time with friends. Meanwhile, parents can participate in programs such as our weekly Game Night or a well-deserved evening to themselves, knowing their children are learning, connecting, and having fun.



Thursday-night Camp Kehillah is open to potty-trained children through age 12 from across the community. It is free for registered Tent families. For families outside The Tent, the cost is \$25 for one child or \$40 for two or more children. It also offers a welcoming introduction for families who are curious about The Tent and want their children to experience its warmth, creativity, and sense of belonging.

Thanks to the generosity of **The Dizik Family Fund**, Camp Kehillah is also offered at no charge on Friday evenings when Temple Beth El does not have a Rated E for Everyone Shabbat experience. These evenings allow children to embrace Shabbat in ways that are engaging and meaningful to them. At the same time, parents can pause after a busy week, reflect, connect with one another, and welcome Shabbat as a community.

These experiences are about more than providing children's programming. Every time families enter TBE, share an experience, and build a relationship, they strengthen their connection to our community. Over time, Temple becomes less like a building they visit and more like a home where they are known, valued, and empowered to participate. We expect Camp Kehillah to continue growing as we listen and respond to the needs of our families. Thursday evenings and Shabbat experiences are only the beginning.

The Tent and Camp Kehillah reflect our commitment to accessible Jewish education, practical support for families, and a Temple community where everyone can belong. Together, they invite families to learn, connect, contribute, and help our village flourish.

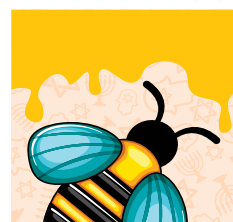

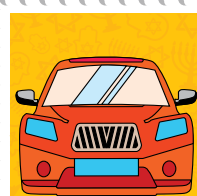

CELEBRATING JEWISH CUISINE WITH PLATINUM DISH CATERING

There is not one Jewish holiday, life event, or any kind of gathering that does not involve some type of food that brings people together.

ACORN SQUASH SOUP *Servings: 12*

INGREDIENTS

- 4 Tbsp. unsalted butter
- 2 Cups celery, coarsely chopped
- 2 Cups onions, coarsely chopped
- 1 Cup toasted sliced almonds, reserve for garnish
- 4 Whole acorn squash, peeled, seeded, coarsely chopped
- 6 Cups chicken stock
- 1 Cup cream
- 2 Tbsp. brown sugar
- Salt to taste

DIRECTIONS

- Melt butter in pot; add vegetables. Sauté over medium heat for 20 minutes, stirring frequently.
- Add hot chicken stock and remaining ingredients (reserving toasted almonds). Simmer 20 minutes or until all vegetables are very tender.
- Pour soup through strainer, reserving liquid; transfer solid food to food processor or blender. Add 1/2 of the reserved liquid and process until smooth.
- Return soup to pot and add remaining liquid to desired consistency. Season with salt to taste. Heat and serve with toasted almond garnish.

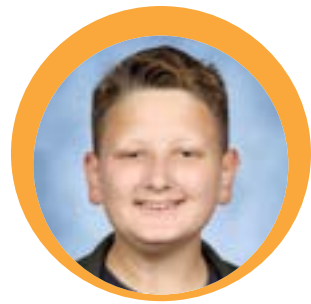

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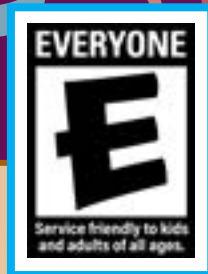
